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Evidences for Jesus' resurrection:

- (1) The Bible records the Resurrection, and the gospel accounts meet all the standards of reliable history.
 - Eyewitnesses
 - Consistency—within each account and among all the witnesses
 - Corroboration—surrounding evidence must be consistent (e.g., empty tomb)
 - Accuracy—is our present account an accurate rendition of the original eyewitness account?

- (2) There is an empty tomb in Jerusalem.
- (3) Take only the "core facts":
 - Jesus died.
 - The disciples were in a state of despair.
 - Eyewitnesses reported that Jesus was raised.
 - The disciples were willing to sacrifice everything for Christ.
 - Paul was converted and became a missionary.
