Trust His Word; in His time He will give you His best.



### David Spared Saul Again 1 Samuel 26:1–25

David learned and grew in his trust and obedience to the Lord.

- In David's first encounter with Saul, he nearly removed Saul himself (ch. 24).
- In David's conflict with Nabal, he nearly avenged himself upon Nabal (ch 25).
- God intervened in both situations to teach David.
- In David's second encounter with Saul, David did the right thing (ch. 26).
- v. 1–4 The Ziphites were of the tribe of Judea but had no loyalty to David (23:19).
  - Enemies are relentless, pop up everywhere, and exist where there should be friends.
  - When you are doing right, there will always be something or someone to oppose you.
- v. 5–6 David needed to make a bold move to confront Saul.
  - Sometimes we retreat from enemies and sometime we must confront enemies.
  - When you are doing right, God will provide allies to help you.
- v. 7–12 David was tested by God.
  - Abishai had a reasonable interpretation of God's will for David.
  - David had the right interpretation of God's will.
  - David must not overstep his place and usurp God's authority.
  - David believed the Lord was alive and would accomplish His will by His power.
  - David learned to trust the Lord to bring about the right outcome.
  - When you are doing right, you must let God do the work by His power Zecheriah 4:6
     So he answered and said to me: This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' Says the LORD of hosts.
- v. 13–16 David demonstrated the failure of Saul's kingdom.
  - By taking Saul's spear and water, David left Saul was helpless and defeated.
  - By rebuking Abner, David showed that God's protection was removed from Saul.
- v. 17–25 David vindicates himself before Saul.
  - David tries to convince Saul of his innocence and plea with him to repent.
  - Saul would not repent nor relent from his selfish hate-filled grip on power.
    - People being influenced by Satan are erratic and irrational.
    - People being influenced by Satan are liars and live a lie.
    - People being influenced by Satan appear to be secure. They are insecure.
    - People being influenced by Satan flaunt their evil out in the open.
    - People being influenced by Satan will eventually be destroyed.

The most important reason David a good king is because he always yielded to the Lord.

Brother and sister, we must be yielded to the Lord in all things.
