Introduction: Martin Scorsese's new film: Silence

- 17th century Portuguese missionaries go to Japan to find their missing mentor.
- Scorsese uses the story to ask the questions:
 - o How do we cope with the difficulties of life when God is silent?
 - Does the silence of God necessarily mean the absence of God?
- Silence in the Old Testament denotes divine judgment.
- Gives us some insight as to what transpired during the most significant 3 days in the history of mankind.
- I. Friday There was silence in heaven.
 - a. Darkness from noon until three o'clock
 - b. Jesus called out: Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachtani! and silence shrouded heaven!!!
 - c. At the cross, two things happened:
 - i. Jesus died a physical death
 - 1. He was the ram in the thicket for Abraham.
 - 2. He was Jacob's ladder.
 - 3. He was the lamb without blemish.
 - 4. He was the scapegoat.
 - 5. He was the serpent on a pole that brought life to all with the poison of the serpent.
 - 6. Jesus in His death closed the circle on all of that foreshadowing.
 - ii. Something even more greater and more spectacular was happening.
 - 1. At the cross, God credited your sin debt and my sin debt to Jesus and brought judgment against Him.
 - 2. God had gone silent in judgment on Jesus (Eloi, Eloi...)
 - 3. It is finished!
 - d. The race was on to get everything done that had to be done by sundown.
