It is more important than obtaining material possessions, having a good job, or winning anyone's approval. Let us recognize that God has given you these precious children. They are his gift to us, but He wants us to lead them back to Him.

PARENT'S VOW

- 1. **Parent's Vow**. Introduction

The title of our message this morning is: "Let the Little Children Come to Jesus". What a joy and what a great responsibility it is to have children. For some this is a difficult day, because you would love to have children but are not able to have any. Regardless, we are all

stewards of the children of this church. We all said vows today regarding the children of our church.

John Chrysostom, called the "golden mouthed" and "silver tongued" preacher, Bishop of Constantinople in the early church, said this about children:

Higher than every painter, higher than every sculptor and higher than all artists do I regard the one who is skilled in the art of forming the soul of children. —St. John Chrysostom (349-407)

Let me just say the greatest missionaries in the world today are missionary mom and missionary dad. You don't have to be a parent to be a father or mother to children. When I came to know Christ, my parents were lost, but in the church, I had 50 fathers and 50 mothers to guide me in the faith.

Children are precious, amen?! Jesus loves children. Jesus says you either have to be a child or be like a child to enter the kingdom. I want us to see the attitude of Jesus toward children. Jesus wants children to come to him. That's the message for today. Jesus loves little children. Let's read about it.

Scripture Reading

Mark 10:13-16 | People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. ¹⁴ When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. ¹⁵ Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." ¹⁶ And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them."

Jesus had a very busy day. He had healed many. He was teaching thousands. The disciples thought Jesus was far too important to deal with children.

1. AVOID WRONG IDEAS ABOUT CHILDREN (10:13)

Mark 10:13 | People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them.

The parents were bringing their dear children to Jesus. But his disciples were trying to keep the children away, since in their minds, Jesus was way too important that he should have to deal with children. How sad is that, but we often think other things are more important than children.

As best we can gather, fathers and mothers were bringing their young children, many of whom were babies (for that is how Luke describes them in his parallel account, 18:15), to Jesus for his blessing.¹ It was a very ancient tradition in Israel to have rabbis bless the children, even little infants. But there was a problem. The disciples were missing the greatest evangelistic opportunity in Israel. They were sadly blind the spiritual needs of the children.

KIDS TOO YOUNG TO KNOW GOD

I don't know why the disciples rebuked the parents and told them to stop bothering Jesus with the children. But I do know that all of us have been guilty at times of having a selfish heart and missing the greatest opportunity in the world. Children need the Lord! We should expect children to grasp spiritual things. Often, they grasp the transcendent God in a far greater way than the most intelligent of adults.

Do not discount the children because they are young. *It's more crucial that we reach them now because they are young*. If you do not point them to Christ, you may lose them to the world. How many of you wish you would have heard the Gospel as a child, but you didn't, and you ended up wasting precious years of your life?

The disciples rebuke came because of ignorance regarding the children's need. If they had been sick or deranged or demon possessed, the apostles would not only have allowed them to come, they would have brought them to the Lord Jesus and helped them along the way. What they did not see, was that they were in far greater need of the Savior because they were coming to the Son of God simply as children who were in sin—they looked fine on the inside, but these children were in need of the Savior's grace. That my friend is the condition of every boy and girl in this church today who has not been converted through the regenerating grace of God the Holy Spirit. They are sinners, lost, under the wrath of God. If they have not been brought to a knowledge of Jesus Christ.

PARENTS TOO BUSY

We as parents can sometimes be so busy providing for our family, we have the tendency to neglect what is most important for our family, specifically, bringing our children to Jesus Christ. It is important to work, it is important to serve the local church, but we must never sacrifice our family's spiritual need to come to Jesus on the altar of 21st century busyness.

Today we have a thousand ways of **technology** to supposedly save time, but if we are not careful, we will waste our time, and our family, specifically our children will get the leftovers, which isn't much.

What is it that excites you? Don't be too busy to spend regular time with your children evangelizing them and then discipling them. Some men are more excited about their golf game or a new account at work than spending time with their own children. It is good to have zeal and ambition. But put your zeal and ambition in the right place. Do you weep for your children's souls? They are daily coming closer to their appointment with God.

This day with your children will never be repeated. Cherish the moment. There will be a time very soon when you will not have this great influence over them. Your children will soon be gone. Reach them while you still have influence with them. You may say, I will wait until they understand more to teach them. You are making a mistake! Don't turn your children away from Jesus!

You may be faithful in the work of the church, but that does *not* mean your children will come to Christ. You must personally invest in them with the Gospel. Years ago, the attitude was, if you take care of God's church, God will take care of your family. This was especially the case among preachers of the Gospel, and many families were lost. But this was also the case in many families at the time, and it is still the case today.

PARENTS TOO DISTRACTED WITH WRONG PRIORITIES

We as parents we are often distracted the wrong priorities. It is good to have a solid work ethic for our children, but we can be busy about the wrong things. We can be so blinded to our children's spiritual needs that we neglect our children. Jesus' disciples were shockingly rebuking the parents from bringing their children to Jesus.

- What good is a good education if they lose their soul?
- What good is a great job without Christ forever?
- What good is a ton of money if they live in hell for eternity?
- We must realize that by training our children now for Christ, we are training future men and women!

Children are the greatest mission field in the world.

O how we need to bring our children to Jesus! How we need to see them come to know the Lord! The greatest mission field in all the world is right here before us! Children—they must be taught what it is to come the Lord at a young age! This is the theme of our message this Lord's Day! Let the children come to Jesus!

2. **CONSIDER JESUS' DESIRE FOR CHILDREN** (10:14)

A JEALOUS DESIRE

What is it that makes Jesus angry?

Mark 10:14 | When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."

Jesus is furious. It is interesting to see the cause. We might have thought that other matters were more important, like evangelizing the key leaders. But no, nothing is more important to Jesus than the spiritual welfare of children. Jesus died so that children, and those who become like children, could be saved.²

A Terrible Neglect

Christ is zealous to save little ones that **his anger flashes** when we neglect the spiritual well-being of little ones. Shall not the Lamb that was slain receive the full reward for his suffering?! Christ would today bring your little ones in to the Kingdom. Will you neglect them and think that He will not save them? How do we neglect them?

- We expose them to worldly things that will enslave them and think it's cute.
- We allow our children's friends to raise them and teach them how to live.
- We neglect them when we fail to pray for and with our children
- When we fail to lovingly and earnestly teach them the Gospel.
- When we get exasperated with them
- When we do not spend time with them and show other things to be more important than them.

A Damnable Indifference

One way we hinder children, is that we as parents do not really expect the conversion of our children. Imagine coming to the gates of heaven and having to say goodbye to your children. How many mothers and fathers really expect their children to be converted at an early age? How will they come without you evangelizing them?

Your indifference will show in their lives. The fact that you do not pray for them, that you do not evangelize them, and that you do not admonish them in the way of the Lord may be the reason why you may lose your child to the world in just a few short years. Are you teaching your children?

A TENDER DESIRE

Mark 10:14b | When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them..."

Jesus has a tender love for children. What was his desire? He said he wanted them "to come to me". They must never be hindered because they belong to the Lord.

What is it that makes one who is so gentle and loving to be furious? It is when we neglect to bring Jesus our children. You see our children are really not our children anyway. They are the Lord's!

Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward. ⁴ Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. ⁵ Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them! He shall not be put to shame when he speaks with his enemies in the gate. —*Psalm 127:3-5*

We must not treat our children as if they are exclusively our own. Our children are on loan from the Lord. When we neglect our children, we enflame the indignation of God and his Son Jesus Christ.

A KINGDOM DESIRE

G. Campbell Morgan called this verse "The Magna Carta for Children." It means the "Great Charter," or "the most important contract" for children. What should parents and elders and church members be thinking of when they think of children? This command from Jesus!

Mark 10:14 | When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.

It is a double imperative – as strong as he can make it. "Allow them to come – do not forbid them." Interestingly, Jesus chose the word for "children" (*paidon*) that signifies a very little or young child, even an infant.

The idea is you cannot start too early telling your children of Jesus. When the child is in the womb, sing to that child about Jesus Christ. Pray for that child to know Jesus. Speak of them of His love. Instruct them about His infinite power and love for them. He can save them. He died for their sins! You cannot start too young to evangelize your children.

What is the Kingdom of Heaven?

What exactly is the Kingdom of heaven? John MacArthur gives an excellent definition. He says,

The kingdom of heaven is the sphere of God's rule in Christ through gracious salvation. —John MacArthur, Jr.

For those who have reached the age when personal saving faith can be exercised, the kingdom is entered by a divinely illuminated understanding of what it means to trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.³

The implication is that children have the capacity to enter the Kingdom. We don't know what age a child understands, but I believe it is much sooner than any of us might realize. Sometimes little children have a greater faith, and a greater understanding than any of us knowledgeable adults!

Prime Candidates for the Kingdom

The prime candidate for the Kingdom of God is either a child, or someone who has the attitude of a humble child. This is the most important realization a parent can have. There is nothing greater or more valuable you can give your child besides the Kingdom of God.

For what does it profit a man [child] to gain the whole world and forfeit his [or her] own soul? —Mark 8:36

Telling your children of Jesus is far more important than what school they attend. It is far more important than what spouse they choose. It is far more important than the job they are called to or the money they make.

My Testimony: Jesus desires your children to come to Him. Isn't it sad that I had to come to know Christ because an evangelistic group came to my public school and invited me to a religious service? My mother and father never taught me about Jesus Christ.

Sadly, my parents introduced me to cable television instead of introducing me to Jesus. When I came to know Christ my parents never brought me to a place of worship. I had to navigate that by myself. But Jesus would have your children come to Him. He would have you bring your children to Jesus.

Children Should Come into the Kingdom

In saying, "<u>for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these</u>," he affirms the value of a child's soul. They *are* the first candidates he takes to himself! Here Christ affirms and proclaims the spiritual capacity of children. If there ever was a text relevant to child evangelism, this is it. Children can authentically come to Christ early on!⁴ Charles Haddon Spurgeon once rightly said,

A child of five, if properly instructed, can as truly believe and be regenerated as an adult. A child who knowingly sins can savingly believe.

—Charles Haddon Spurgeon

3. COME TO JESUS AS CHILDREN (10:15)

We all need to come to Jesus like a child, "receive the kingdom...like a little child" vs. 15.

Mark 10:15 | Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.

The word translated "never" is very strong. Without total humility you will *never*, *never*, *never*, *never* enter into God's Kingdom.

CHILDREN ARE HUMBLE

Children are humble.

You will be lost forever unless you become so humble that you are willing to lose your reputation. Children are sinners. They have a deep need, but they are so humble, they are willing to admit that need. They cry out when they have a need.⁵

"Mama, I need food. I need a bath. I need a hug."

Children can be so humble, they will express their needs boldly, without consideration of their reputation, because, for the most part, they are not aware of their reputation.

Once I was in an important meeting. I think we had a couple visiting at our home. We were at our kitchen table deep in discussion of things of the Lord, and I hear from the bathroom, "Daddy, wipe me." I can't remember which child, but the point is, when a child has a need they are bold to come to their father in time of need! That's the bold humility of a child.

CHILDREN ARE HELPLESS

Children are.

What Jesus also has in mind here is an *objective* state which every child who has ever lived, regardless of race, culture, or background, has experienced—*helpless dependence*.

Every single child in the world is absolutely, completely, totally, objectively, subjectively, existentially helpless! And so it is with every child who is born into the Kingdom of God. Children of the Kingdom enter it helpless, ones for whom everything must be done. As Augustus Toplady composed:

Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling; Naked, come to Thee for dress: Helpless, look to Thee for grace.⁶

The truth is, we are all helpless to save ourselves. Have you come to Christ like this? Is it his grace plus your nothingness? The realization that one is as helpless as a child naturally fosters humility. Jesus gave reference to this connection when, in a similar but separate statement, he said,

I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles

himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. —Matthew 18:3-4, NIV

CHILDREN WANT ACCEPTANCE

Children expect to be accepted.

They expect to be loved. A 4-year-old walks in and is sure everybody is interested in what she or he wants to say. They're positive everyone will find them completely interesting. They're totally sure of acceptance.⁷

On my way back from Brazil several years ago, I met a little boy named Arturo on our cramped airplane. I'm sure it was a 747, but it was a full flight. Little 4-year-old Arturo's head was on his father's lap, but Arturo's feet were sprawled out right below my chin. I had to be careful – sometimes I got a little kick in the chin. I didn't mind at all! I told the dad, I'm not bothered, and I wasn't! And Arturo was just fine. He felt totally fine and welcomed. John Calvin hit the nail on the head. He said,

The passage broadens to give kingdom citizenship to both children and those who are like them. —John Calvin⁸

Parents, the best gift you can give to your children is to come to Jesus Christ yourself. Don't trust in your religion. You may be Protestant or Catholic or Methodist. Religion never saved anyone. The devils believe in God and tremble. You cannot come through a church or through your mother or father. You must come through Jesus Christ. Jesus said,

I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes unto the Father except through me. —*John 14:6*

Listen again to the words of Jesus.

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. —*Matthew 11:28-29*

4. **JESUS' BLESSING FOR CHILDREN** (10:16)

Jesus' **blessing** for children, "he took the children...and blessed them" vs. 16.

Mark 10:16 | And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them."

A FERVENT BLESSING

Children were always comfortable with Jesus. They could tell he loved them. They lay their heads against his chest, and he "blessed them." The word translated "blessed" means "**fervently blessed**." Christ was enthusiastic! He was filled with deep joy! Christ did this joyfully, with a fervent heart, for they refreshed his spirit. Jesus must have smiled with infinite kindness as He looked into the faces of those tiny children. We do not know the specific nature

of His blessing, but we can surmise that He prayed for them to enter the Kingdom by faith, and some of them who could understand were blessed at that moment with eternal salvation.⁹

A PRIORITIZED BLESSING

Look at the love of Christ for your children. How do you get your priorities rightly aligned? We must look at Christ's *heart*. We must see that the only hope for our children is to bring them to Jesus.

Don't Prioritize this World

Be careful not to lead your children to what is good, only to miss the best.

- A nice home and car, and
- A good education and
- Good grades will do your children no good in hell.
- We must bring them to Christ.

Christ literally took these children in his arms one by one from the mothers and fathers. He took care personally to deal with each one. **Verse 16**, "And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them." It is the parent's responsibility to teach and evangelize their children—we seek His blessing, specifically the blessing of the *new birth*. Without that radical transformation of the heart, no one will enter into the kingdom of God (**John 3:3**). We need Christ to take our children in His arms and transform them!

Make Sure You Prioritize Jesus

We as parents, especially fathers, are **responsible** to bring our children to Jesus. We assist Jesus in spiritual heart surgery. We must constantly feel the weight and burden that our children may one day enter hell if we neglect their soul! We are responsible for what goes into our child's heart 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. Do not allow yourself to wiggle out of that responsibility. You will be held accountable for raising your children.

Do you desire to be held in Christ's arms, to hear him pronounce blessings over you? Do you have the blessing of eternal salvation?

Conclusion

For some of you this has been a difficult message. You may be here today, and you may be someone who has lost a child. The pain never goes away. Or perhaps you have longed for children and though you've never had children, you feel a sense of loss.

Let me tell you, that God knows your loss. The reason we can have eternal life is because Our heavenly Father gave up His perfect, spotless, wonderful Son. Our children sin, but God's Son never did anything wrong.

There is coming a day when we will all stand before God. What will happen at that day? We will all stand alone. Bring your children to Jesus. Bring yourself to Jesus in childlike faith. "Of such is the Kingdom of heaven!" The most awful thought if you are a parent is to get to the gates of heaven and have to say goodbye forever. I don't want to go through the gates of heaven without my children with me.

Let us be committed to praying for our lost children, and praying that these young ones might come to Christ at an early age.
