The Preacher and the Jailer

Acts 16:25-40

Introduction

Both groups have a common denominator – perceived threats to their *positions, prominence,* and *prosperity*.

v19

As living witnesses for Jesus Christ, Christians are not to fear personal loss. Nor should their actions on behalf of Christ be predicated on an expectation of earthly gain.

v21

"They advocate customs..."

It is not a code of conduct that we follow, but a Savior.

v22

"beat them with rods"

v23

Evil intent fears not its open display of hypocrisy.

v24

"inner prison"

"fastened their feet in the stocks"

v25

Psalm 42:8

God gives us a song in the night that becomes our passionate prayer offered to Him.

"psalms and hymns, and spiritual songs" - Colossians 3:16

1 John 5:4-5

"the prisoners were listening to them"

v26

The earthquake happened, not to deliver Paul and Silas, but the Jailer.

v27

To Paul and Silas, the "great earthquake" meant freedom. To the jailer, it meant death.

v28

One of the greatest Christlike virtues ever: self-forgetfulness

v29

"trembling with fear"

It was the jailer who was imprisoned, not Paul and Silas.

"fell down before Paul and Silas"

v30

"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" The universal cry of the lost around the world.

Why would this rough jailer go to his captives for a remedy to his fears?

The theological answer: John 6:44

Hosea 11:4

The practical answer: Acts 16:17

Those who insist on clinging to earthly things for security and significance forfeit their own salvation.

Salvation means being healed and being safe, not from all harm, but from the wrath of God!

v31 Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.
