The Dangers of Prophecy 2 Kings 8:7-15

- **I.** THE KING'S CONCERN (7-8; Ecc 8:8)—Will I recover?
 - A. The Perspective of a Dying Man—Ben-hadad, King of Assyria
 - 1. The <u>Helplessness</u> of Mortality (Ps 49:10-13, 16-19)—death comes for all
 - 2. The Worthlessness of Idols (2 Kg 1:2; 1 Chron 16:26; Isa 44:9)—they can't help
 - 3. The Value of a true Man of God (2 Kg 3:11)
 - a. His God is real.
 - b. He speaks the truth.
 - B. The Benefit of an Honest Answer (Ecc 7:2, 4)—denied to Ben-hadad by Hazael
 - 1. Hear the questions behind the question.
 - a. Am I going to die? ()—YES. Prepare for it. Death puts life into perspective.
 - **b.** How am I going to die?—encourages a false sense of control
 - **c.** How long do I have until I die? (Ps 90:12; Mat 25:13; Heb 3:7, 15)—order your priorities
 - 2. A half-truth is misleading (Mat 28:20)
 - 3. A <u>false sense of security</u> is deadly. You can't count on time in the future.
- II. $\underline{\mathsf{HAZAEL'S}}$ AMBITION (13-15)—Am I a dog?
 - A. <u>His Opinion of Himself</u> (Jer 17:9; Ps 36:2)—conflicted and unrealistic
 - **1.** I'm a Nobody.—I couldn't do that if I wanted to!
 - **2.** I'm not that Bad! ()—I would never do such a thing!

- B. His Response to the Word (Isa 55:11; Heb 4:12)—
 - 1. The prophecy <u>reveals</u> the worst in his character.
 - 2. He <u>uses it to justify</u> his treachery.
- **III.** THE PROPHET'S PROFESSION—not easy, not hard-hearted
 - **A.** <u>His Journey</u> (7; 1 Kin 19:5-6, 15; Mat 15:24; Lk 4:25-27)—capital of foreign enemy
 - **B.** His Gaze (Heb 4:12-13)—
 - 1. The **Eyes of the LORD** see everything.—nothing is hidden from Him
 - **2.** The <u>Word of God</u> discerns the heart.—reveals its thoughts and intents How you respond to the word of the Lord reveals your character.
 - 3. The Knowledge of the Prophet unnerves the guilty.—Hazael was ashamed
 - C. His Tears (Ecc 1:18)—express the heart of God
 - 1. God does not delight in the death of the wicked. (Ezek 18:23, 31-32)
 - **2.** The message of judgment is <u>delivered with tears</u>. (Isa 22:4; Jer 13:17; 17:16; Lk 19:41; 23:27)
 - 3. The <u>cross of Jesus</u> answers both the justice and the mercy of God.

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
