III. The "Christ" In Mark - "According to the Scripture"

- A. The Purpose of Mark's Gospel Two-Fold
 - 1. Historical significance
 - a. The most neglected Gospel
 - i. most consider it to be the first written
 - ii. 90% of the stories are in Matthew and Luke
 - iii. rougher style than its peers (probably dictated by Peter)
 - iv. has more problem passages that the others smooth out
 - v. no commentary written until the sixth century
 - b. most intensely studied today
 - 2. Presents Jesus' Mission
 - a. as the Messiah and Son of God Mk 1:1-8:30
 - i. His humanness no mention of birth or childhood, or genealogy, b/c a servants genealogy is not important
 - emphasizes Jesus' humanity by using name of "Jesus"
 - emphasizes Jesus' emotions
 - -grieved, sighing deeply in His Spirit –7:34; 8:12
 - -moved w/ pity 6:34
 - -marveling at unbelief 6:6
 - -indignant at the conduct of disciples 10:14
 - -anger w/ His critics 3:5
 - -deeply distressed 14:33
 - emphasizes human characteristics
 - -the need to be alone 1:35
 - -the need for sleep 4:38
 - -the need to pray 6:46
 - -loneliness 10:32
 - ii. His Divinity and Ministry The Son of God
 - His baptism underscored w/ The Father's Proclamation 1:11; Ps 2:7.12
 - w/ John the Baptizer as His forerunner 1:1-13
 - Immediately used 41 times speaking to the urgency of the ministry
 - the title "Son of Man"
 - -used 14 times in Mark
 - -used in OT as a synonym for man Ps 8:4; 144:3
 - -used in Daniel definitely deals with His divinity
 - -used by Jesus of himself to indicate Authority, victory,

lowliness and suffering

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- Key word in this section - Authority
                   -emphasized in the use of the "Kingdom of God"
                   -refers to His divine sovereign authority
                   -used 15 times in Mark
                          -to forgive sins - 2:10
                          -over the OT law - 2:27
                          -over the tribes of Israel by calling the 12 disciples -

                          -over the creation - 4:39,41
                          -over demons - 5:1-20 legion
                          -over disease - 5:25-34
                          -over death - 5:35-43
                   -concludes with Peter's confession - 8:29
b. as the OT's Suffering Servant of Isa 53 - Mk 8:31-16:8
      i. Starting in 8:30, Jesus predicts His own death 3 times in 3 chapters -
      8:31; 9:31; 10:32-34
      ii. Jesus' own words - Mk 10:45
             - ransom - something to loosen with, a redemption price
             (atonement):--ransom.
             - pays for the sins to restore people to a right relationship w/ God
      iii. Keeping His Messiahship Secret
             - 1st public disclosure - triumphal entry - 11:1-11 - Fulfilling Zec 9:9
             - He silences
                   -demons - 1:25,34; 3:11-12; 5:7
                   -those healed - 1:44; 5:43; 7:36; 8:26
                   -the disciples - 8:30; 9:9
             - b/c the expectations of the Jews - a warrior Messiah King
             - in order to fulfill His true suffering role of the Messiah - Ps 40:6-
             10; Is 42:1,19; 49:6; 52:13-14; 53; Eze 34:23-24; 37:24-25; Zec 3:8
      iv. Provoking the religious leaders
             - 2nd cleansing of the temple - 11:1-11
             - controversies w/ religious leaders - 11:27-33; 12:13-37
             - parables indicating they were the problem - 12:1-12
             - their response, plot to kill Him - 11:18; 12:12; 14:1
             - the events that follow
                   -Judas' betrayal and arrest,
                   -unlawful trials,
