- Frequently brought before God

The Prayer:

- Paul asked God to fill the Colossians with the knowledge of His will through Spirit-given wisdom and knowledge, so that they might live a worthy life that pleases God.
- Bearing fruit in every good work.
- Growing in the knowledge of God.
- Being strengthened with power for endurance and patience.
- Giving joyful thanks to the Father for salvation.

Heavenly Father, thank you for _____. Would you fill them with the knowledge of your will? By your Holy Spirit, please give them the wisdom and understanding to learn what your will is, as they search the scriptures. Help them to live the kind of life that pleases you in every way. I ask you to strengthen _____ with your power, so that they can have endurance in every difficult situation and patience toward all people in their lives. May they realize that they are no longer living in the kingdom of darkness, but in Christ’s kingdom of light, looking forward to the wonderful hope of heaven.
