God is always doing 10,000 things in your life, and you may be aware of only 3 of them. (John Piper)

Background to Habakkuk 2

- Habakkuk 1 focused on: TRIAL, PROBLEMS, CONFUSION
- Habakkuk 2 focuses on: TRUST, PERSPECTIVE, CONVICTION

Here in Habakkuk 2, there are a lot of intertextual allusions that interplay together here. Habakkuk is building upon Isaiah. And, Isaiah builds upon Psalms & Samuel.

- There is a lot of theology, intertextual allusions/echoes, providence of God, prophecies from God, and promises of deliverance!

THESIS — Habakkuk 2 is a chapter where GOD GIVES CLARITY as to how to live, how to think & how to hope.

God wants you to <u>watch</u>, <u>trust</u>, <u>know</u> & <u>hope</u>. It's a chapter about Trust, Faith, Perspective.

I. GOD CALLS YOU TO WATCH! (1-3)

Your observation

Don't lose hope! Keep trusting! Keep alert! God will answer.

II. GOD CALLS YOU TO TRUST! (4)

Your conviction

This is the "watchword of Christianity, the key to the whole book of Habakkuk & the central theme of all the Scriptures" (Charles Feinberg).

III. GOD CALLS YOU TO KNOW! (5-20)

Your consideration

- Now we have a 5-fold series of *funeral dirge/laments* on the Babylonians/Chaldeans.
- Woe = a lamentation; a cry of lament; a cry of judgment.
- It referred to a "funeral dirge" it was used of mourning for the dead at a funeral (1 Kings 13.30)

❖5 "Woe" pronouncements [upon Babylon]:

- 1. Woe for **GREED**/AGGRESSION intimidation (6-8)
- 2. Woe for **EXPLOITATION**/EXTORTION evil gain; intemperance (9-11)
- 3. Woe for **VIOLENCE** iniquity, hatred, murder, evil (2:12-14)
- 4. Woe for **IMMORALITY** indignity/seduction, selfishness (2:15-17) So bad is this: they will drink the "cup of the Lord's wrath" (v.16b; Jer 25.15, 17)
- 5. Woe for **IDOLATRY** idolatry (2:18-20) v.18 'what profit is there'? No breath (Ps 115; Ps 135)

Jer 51.24 - God says: I will repay Babylon for all their evil!

IV. GOD CALLS YOU TO HOPE! (14)

Your expectation

- 1 Peter 1.21 your "faith & your hope are in GOD"
- Heb 11.1 faith is the assurance of things *hoped for!*
 - We are called to live by faith & have HOPE!

Babylon is momentary and will be burned up. Contrast that with God's kingdom.

* God's glory WILL fill the earth.

- God's glory will fill the earth. This is built on/alluding to Isaiah 11.9 (cf. 11.1-9)
- GOD will overthrow future Babylon (Rev 17-18; Jer 50-51) and then his glory will fill the earth.
- When the Messiah rules in His kingdom, knowledge of the LORD will be worldwide. > worldwide; expansive; thorough; unmistakable; righteous; peaceful.
- This will occur in the Millennium when the Messiah will be reigning (Isa 9.6-7)
- Jerusalem will have the prominence in the world (Isa 2.2)
- and Judah and Israel will be regathered to the land in belief and repentance (Zech 12-14) and will be living according to the New Covenant (Ezek 36-37, 40-48)
- The Millennium can hardly be in existence now since these factors do not characterize the present age.

Why all	this about the glory	of the LORD	filling the eart	th in v.14? It	gives ste	eadfast Ho	pe that our Go	d decrees,	rules,

Conclusion:

- God's message is clear to Habakkuk. **Stop** complaining. **Stop** doubting.
- God is *not* indifferent to sin. God is not absent, God is not far off. God is not apathetic or uninterested. He is in fact in control. He is perfect.
