Following the command to "Walk in the Spirit" and the description of the works of the flesh that stand in opposition to the fruit of the Spirit, Paul moves on to exhort the reader as to how to deal with a sinning brother. Sin happens! How we respond to sin in others, or our own sin, must be the outworking of the fruit of the Spirit. If not, we will only compound the sin.

But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise. 13 We, however, will not boast beyond measure, but within the limits of the sphere which God appointed us—a sphere which especially includes you. 14 For we are not overextending ourselves (as though our authority did not extend to you), for it was to you that we came with the gospel of Christ; 15 not boasting of things beyond measure, that is, in other men's labors, but having hope, that as your faith is increased, we shall be greatly enlarged by you in our sphere, 16 to preach the gospel in the regions beyond you, and not to boast in another man's sphere of accomplishment. 17 But "he who glories, let him glory in the Lord." 18 For not he who commends himself is approved, but whom the Lord commends.
