## Contend Earnestly For the Faith Which Was Once For All Handed Down to the Saints An Expositional Study of the **Epistle of Jude**Part 19- **Jude 24&25**

210- Standing in God's Presence Blameless- Part 2

Welcome again my beloved in Christ. We are continuing our verse by verse study of the **Epistle of Jude** and today I want to continue to look at what Jude taught about "God Empowering us to be able to Stand in God's Presence Blameless and with Great Joy." So, let's read Jude verses 24 and 25 again together:

24 Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy,
25 to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.

Now these two verses of Jude deal with one of the most important and misunderstood subjects that is in the entire Bible. And that subject is just how God can present us faultless before the Presence of His Glory with exceeding joy.

In other words- Jude is telling us here that not only is God able to keep us from falling- but God is also able to present us faultless on that day. But just how does God do that if we continue to sin after we are saved? Do the sins that we commit after we are saved affect our Salvation to the point where a genuinely saved person can lose his Salvation? Some sincere believers say, "Yes", while others who are equally save ad equally sincere say, "No.". So, who's right?

First of all, we have to understand that although this is a very serious issue- the answer is really not complicated at all. The Bible is very clear about this- Salvation is not something that Man does for Godbut Salvation is something that God does for Man.

And so, in order to get this right- we have to go over three very important and yet misunderstood concepts:

- 1. The Absolute Sovereignty of God
- 2. The Radical Ruination of Man
- 3. Grace

Now you may think that you know about all three of these- but I ask you to hear me out before you simply turn me off. Because if you get these three issues in your mind and heart Biblically- the issue of what Jude is talking about here in these two verses and whether or not Salvation is eternal will be settled in your mind and heart forever.

So here goes. There are in the world today three major views of Salvation. The first goes like this:

Salvation is something that Man originates. Being saved is Man's idea and comes to pass as a result of the exercise of his own human will or from his own free choice. As such, Salvation is only as good as Man makes it out to be and people can get it and lose it several times over their lifetime.

Now this first view of Salvation is ancient- it began in the Garden and today this view is accepted and taught and trusted in by more people than any other view. The overwhelming majority of the people on earth today ascribe to this view. But even though this view is the most popular view of Salvation of all the people on earth- please understand, dear friends, that if you agree with this view- you disbelieve what the Bible teaches about The Sovereignty of God; the Fall of Man and Grace because what I just described to you is not Christianity. This view of Salvation that I just described to you that teaches that Salvation is the result of what Man does for himself is called Secular Humanism- not Christianity. And Secular Humanism is the religion of more people than any other religion on earth.

But there is a second view of Salvation that goes something like this:

Salvation is a *cooperative* effort between God and Man. God *wants* to save everybody, but He *can't* because Man won't believe. So lost Man must take the first step in faith toward Christ and God does all the rest. But because Salvation came about as a result of this cooperative effort between God and Man- that cooperation must continue because even after Salvation- Man must *continue on* in his walk with God or he can lose what God did for him.

Now this second view is relatively new- it is only about 400-500 years old. And for the first 300-400 years of its existence- this view was believed only by a small minority of people in the Church. But over the last 100 years or so- this second view has become the dominant view of Salvation that is taught in the average Church today.

But while this second view accepts *some* parts of The Sovereignty of God; the Fall of Man; and Grace- it still nevertheless *minimizes* all three of these Biblical truths and over emphasizes the role that Man plays in his own Salvation much more than the Bible teaches.

Now if you have been listening to these broadcasts for awhile- you will remember that I taught that the *key* to this second view of Salvation is a concept called, "*The Free Will of Man*"- a concept that cannot be found anywhere in the Bible. *Human Free Will* was first taught by the heretic, Pelagius in his battle with Augustine over God's Sovereignty and Grace back in the third and fourth Centuries and later became popular when Jacob Arminius began to teach it in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century. Without Human Free Will- this second view of Salvation cannot hold water.

You may have heard the false concept of Human Free Will taught before. This concept says that Man is what is called a "Free Moral Agent" and the net result of this teaching is that even God Almighty must bow before this notion, and He will never violate the Free Will of Man. And this concept was not officially taught anywhere as being true until The Roman Catholic Church began to teach it immediately after The Protestant Reformation. At that time- The Roman Church discarded what Augustine had taught about God's Sovereignty; Human Depravity and Grace and they adopted what Thomas Aquinas taught.

And here's the real kicker. Human Free Will as taught by this second view of Salvation can only be true if God's Sovereignty and The Fall of Man as the Bible teaches is *not* true. In other words- if what the Bible teaches about God's Character and Nature and The Fall of Adam in the Garden and Grace is true- then the concept of Human Free Will as taught by this second view of Salvation cannot possibly be true. But without the concept of Human Free Will being true- this second view of Salvation falls apart very rapidly. So here is what we have.

We have a view of Salvation that has become the single most popular view of Salvation that is in the modern Church that is held together by a concept that is not taught anywhere in Scripture and which actually does great damage to God's Sovereignty; The Fall of Man and Grace as taught by the Bible. So why anyone who knows this would stick with this second view of Salvation is beyond me.

So, I assume that the only reason why *anyone* who loves the Lord would ever promote this second view of Salvation is only because they have not been properly taught about The Absolute Sovereignty of God; or The Fall of Man or Grace. And so, if we, who lead in the Church, would simply teach what the Bible actually says about Gods' Sovereignty; Human Depravity and Grace- nobody would believe in this second view of Salvation- unless they are just rebellious and don't care what the Bible says.

And so now we come to the third view of Salvation which says this:

Salvation is a Sovereign Work of God alone. Man *cannot* make the first move toward his own salvation because Man is fallen and is dead in trespasses and sins. God alone has to go to lost man because Man is both *incapable* and *unwilling* to come to God on his own.

So, God chooses who will be saved based upon nothing other than what pleases God and He chooses them, and He sets His Love upon them before they were ever born- in fact, God chooses them before He ever created the world. So, this makes Salvation to have nothing to do with human personality or human will or human effort or human desire- but it has to do only with God- therefore God gets all the Glory.

But because Man is fallen- God has to do several things for Man that lost fallen Man cannot do for himself. For example- first God has to become Man and be born of a virgin and Jesus has to live 33-1/2 years on earth and be tempted with every sin imaginable and yet never sin one time. This allows Jesus to perfectly obey His Father's Law- thus fulfilling all the requirements of the Law. By doing this- Jesus developed His Own Personal Righteousness which will be imputed to the unworthy sinner by faith alone which will allow him to enter into Heaven.

Secondly, Jesus has to die with every single sin of every Man imputed to Him so that the full fury and horror of God's wrath against those sins could be poured out upon Jesus. It is this sinless spotless Blood that washes our sins away

Thirdly, Jesus has to rise again from the dead without those sins so that those sins would remain forever in hell. The Resurrection of Jesus from the dead is God's seal of approval on all that Jesus has done.

Fourthly, because Man is lost and fallen- he doesn't care one whit about God or the things of God. So, God the Holy Spirit has to draw every single one of the

chosen people to God for Salvation- mostly against their will. This drawing is not gentle nor passive- but is similar to fishermen drawing fish out of the water in their nets.

Fifthly- God has to go inside the body of the lost fallen sinner and God has to Sovereignly give that person eyes to see; ears to hear; and a heart to believe. God takes out of that person his evil stony heart and replaces it with a heart of flesh. God does this all by Himself without any cooperation or assistance from the Man.

During this stage- God gives that lost soul a brand new divine nature that replaces the sinful nature of Adam that he received at the moment he was conceived.

You see, the will of man rests upon his nature and so before Salvation- the nature of a man is corrupt and fallen and so his ability to freely choose is in bondage. Only by being given a new divine nature can the will of man be free then to choose God. It is also during this stage that God gives to Man the saving faith that he needs in order to believe.

So as a result of all that God has already Sovereignly done for this lost soulhe gets saved. In other words- this lost person can now see- because God has given him new eyes; he can now hear the Truth- because God has given him new ears; He can believe- because God has already given him a new heart; he can trust in Christ because God has given him saving faith; he can now repent because he has a new nature; and he can choose to love and serve God because God has given him a new will.

So as soon as this person hears the Gospel- he will repent and be saved- but the only reason he was saved is because of all that God did for him prior to his being saved.

Now this is the only view of Salvation that the Bible teaches so this third view can rightly be called Biblical Christianity. The Bible never has and never will teach the other two views. The first and second view teaches in some way or fashion a Salvation that is the result of what Man does- or what is called a Salvation of works. Only the third view teaches Salvation by Grace alone through Faith alone by Christ alone.

Now those who adhere to the first view that completely disregards the death, burial, and Resurrection of Jesus and Grace can correctly be called Humanists. Those who adhere to the second view that teaches that Salvation is a cooperative effort between God and Man can rightly be called Catholics. And those who believe the third view that says that Salvation is a Sovereign Work of God alone can correctly be called Christians.

Now where all this ties into what Jude is teaching here is that both the first and second views of Salvation teach that a genuinely saved person can lose their Salvation- precisely because they teach that Salvation is the result of what Man does.

Only the third view teaches that Salvation is eternal- precisely because in this view- Salvation is a Sovereign Work of God alone and has nothing to do with what Man does or does not do for himself or how much or how little Man cooperates with God.

The first two views are full of rules and sacraments and duties and labors and things that Man has to do in order to become good enough to be saved. So, if he falls short or if he doesn't live perfect in those labors- then he loses whatever he had.

The third view is the only view that is full of Grace and Mercy and God doing for Man what Man cannot do for himself. This view alone says that Heaven is gained by Grace through Faith in the finished work of Jesus Christ and not by any human works at all. Therefore, because Salvation was not gained by what we did-Salvation cannot be lost by what we do or what we don't do, and Jude is right, and God will present us faultless before the Presence of His Glory with exceeding Joy.
