The Church's Call to Humble Service (Mattew 19:30-20:28)

Jesus takes the disciples down into the valley to teach them that the way up is down.

I. **Introduction**: Ezekiel 18:25 – Israel's sin of accusing God of injustice

Matthew 19:30 and 20:16 form an *inclusion* which links the parable of the workers to the story of the rich young ruler, as well as a segue to the teaching on humble service later in the chapter

II. Pride vs. Grace: The parable of the laborers in the vineyard (1-16)

A. The detail of the story

The landlord calls laborers to work in his vineyard for a fair wage

The laborers who worked harder feel cheated even though they received their wage

The landlord justifies his action as owner of the vineyard

Romans 9 – The unfairness of grace

B. Warnings to "Firsts"

"Lasts" become first, by grace; "firsts" become last by pride He must increase, I must decrease (1 Peter 5:6, 1 Cor 4:7)

III. Glory vs. Suffering: Jesus' third passion prediction (17-19)

- A. Suffering precedes glory humiliation before exaltation
- B. A call to humble yourself, take up a cross, and receive Christ

IV. Ambition vs. Humility: Jesus teaches the disciples that the way up is down (20-28)

- A. The Zebedees try to climb glory mountain Refined pride becomes ambition
- B. Jesus' patient reply the humanity of Christ
- C. The other ten disciples become indignant Disappointed pride becomes bitterness
- D. Jesus' teaching on the way to greatness by being a servant

V. A Counter-cultural call to the church to serve one another
