Introduction: If the Pharisees thought that Jesus' disciples were unclean due to their neglect of proper, ceremonial hand washing, imagine their response as Jesus leaves to travel to Gentile territory! As He heads west, He finds great faith with a Canaanite woman and feeds a Gentile crowd. He had not seen such faith in Galilee.

History and Prophecy – Ezekiel 26:3-6

Presently located at the town of Sur in southern Lebanon. The little village that exists in this place is nothing like the great and grand nation of Tyre described in Scripture.

Built on an island about a half mile from land, and also with a city on the coast.

Colonists from Tyre founded Carthage.

Hiram, King of Tyre, provided material for the building of Solomon's Temple.

Jezebel, King Ahab's queen, was the daughter of Ethbaal, the King of Tyre and high priest of Baal.

Subjected to Assyria under Sennacherib in 701, but recovered in 630 BC.

Babylon destroyed the coastal city but could not overthrow the island fortress. Nebuchadnezzar tried for 13 years! (586 to 573 BC).

In 332 BC Alexander the Great spent 7 months using the rubble of the coastal town to build a causeway to the island. The people of Tyre sent their children and elderly to Carthage but were prevented from escaping by ships from a multitude of nations that arrived to help Alexander. When he took the city he flattened it, killed 10,000 and sent 30,000 onto slavery. The causeway was never removed and now what was the island is the end of a peninsula where fishermen dry their nets on the flat rocks.

21 "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works which were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. 22 But I say to you, it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon in the day of judgment than for you.

Ezekiel 26:3-6

3 "Therefore thus says the Lord God: 'Behold, I am against you, O Tyre, and will cause many nations to come up against you, as the sea causes its waves to come up. 4 And they shall destroy the walls of Tyre and break down her towers; I will also scrape her dust from her, and make her like the top of a rock. 5 It shall be a place for spreading nets in the midst of the sea, for I have spoken,' says the Lord God; 'it shall become plunder for the nations. 6 Also her daughter villages which are in the fields shall be slain by the sword. Then they shall know that I am the Lord.'

who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, 15 having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, 16 and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. 17 And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. 18 For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father.

10 When Jesus heard it, He marveled, and said to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel! 11 And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 15:28

28 Then Jesus answered and said to her, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be to you as you desire." And her daughter was healed from that very hour.

Mark 7:31

31 Again, departing from the region of Tyre and Sidon, He came through the midst of the region of Decapolis to the Sea of Galilee.
