PERSONAL ARMOR (Pt 2) Shield, Helmet, Sword

Ephesians 6:16-17

- I. THE SHIELD OF FAITH (16; Prov 30:5)
 - A. We Are Under Fire. ()—We have a real and active enemy.
 - 1. The Evil One (Mat 6:13)—personal, intelligent
 - 2. His Fiery Darts
 - a. Accusation (Rom 8:1)
 - **b. Temptation** (1 Cor 10:13)

B. We Need a Shield.

- 1. Purpose of Shield—blocks the impact of enemy weapons
- 2. <u>Type</u> of Shield—large, rectangular, full-body cover
- 3. <u>Use</u> of Shield—in situations of active, incoming enemy fire
 - a. Requires Action (not just possession)—take up the Shield and use it
 - **b. Requires Knowledge:** what you believe, where the attack is coming from, how to cover your entire body with the shield

C. Faith is our Shield.

- 1. Faith in God (1 Pet 1:21)—specifically believing what He has said
- 2. Faith in Action (Jam 2:26)—faith expressing itself in obedience
- 3. Faith Over All—(1 Cor 5:6-7)—it covers everything

II. THE HELMET OF SALVATION ()

- A. A Helmet protects the Head.
 - 1. <u>Importance of the Head</u>—it is the center of...
 - a. Sentience—self-awareness and ability to think
 - **b.** Sensory Perception—recognizing & interacting with external reality
 - **c. Understanding**—interpreting, making sense, knowing what to do
 - 2. <u>Seriousness of a Head Injury</u>—at very least debilitating

- B. The Mind is a Battlefield. Head represents mind
 - 1. Our identity and self-perception
 - 2. Our ability to recognize reality outside ourselves
 - 3. Our ability to correctly assign meaning to what we witness and experience
- C. The Hope of Salvation guards our Mind. (1 Thes 5:8; Tit 1:2)
 - 1. <u>HOPE</u> means a <u>confident expectation of good</u> based upon the promises of God's Word. (Rom 8:28; Heb 6:17-20 &b 10:23)
 - 2. Our Salvation is both present and future—now and not-yet
 - **a. We are Redeemed**. (1 Pet 1:18-19)
 - **b.** We are in Christ. (2 Cor 5:17;).
 - c. We are reconciled to God. (Rom 5:10 & 8:38-39; 2 Cor 5:18)
 - d. We are <u>looking forward</u> to glorification (Rom 8:23-25; 1 Pet 1:3-8)
 - 3. A Christian should never be without hope! (Rom 8:28; Eph 2:12; Col 1:27)
- III. THE SWORD OF THE SPIRIT (17b)—the Word of God
 - A. <u>The Sword</u>—most active, requires most skill, strength, energy, training
 - 1. **Defensive**—protects you by meeting and blocking the enemy's strikes
 - 2. Offensive—threat to the other side, can wound your opponent
 - B. Of The Spirit
 - 1. It is a spiritual weapon, not physical. (Jn 6:63; 2 Cor 10:3-4)
 - 2. The Holy Spirit makes it effective.
 - a. He is the author. —(2 Tim 3:16; 2 Pet 1:20-21)—
 - b. He recalls and applies the Word to us. (Jn 14:26)
 - C. The Word of God
 - **1. Is powerful** (Isa 55:11; Rev 1:16 & 19:15)
 - 2. Is true and <u>authoritative</u>—(Mat 4:1-11)—Jesus weapon of choice
 - **3.** It <u>discerns</u> (Heb 4:12)—clarifies, judges, corrects
 - 4. You have to know it to use it
 - **5.** It is the spoken word (Deut 30:14)
