WHAT THE WITNESS ON TRIAL SAYS

1. Jesus himself testifies that he is equal with God (verses 19–29).
 - Jesus can do everything the Father does (v. 19).
 - Jesus has the power of life, power to raise the dead (vv. 20-21).
 - Jesus has the authority to judge every human (v. 22).
 - Jesus has the right to be worshiped just like the Father (v. 23).
