The Miracle of the Baptism of Jesus (Matthew 3: 13-17)

- Jesus' baptism is a miracle in which Jesus is at the center of it.
- Jesus' baptism is miraculous for several important reasons.
- clear aspects of the miracle: the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus.
- The audible voice of the Father from heaven
- Deeper miraculous truths come to the fore in Jesus' baptism.

I. Understanding Jesus Baptism

- Understand baptism: sinners being united to Christ (1 Cor 12:12,13)
- Jesus' baptism inaugural act of identification & oneness with sinners
- Jesus is recognized by the Father as the head of the Church, His body.
- John objected (3:14) but Jesus insists: "it is fitting for us fulfill all righteousness."

II. Heaven is Opened Up

"When he had been baptized ... behold the heavens were opened to Him" (v.16)

- Jesus fulfills that imagery of Jacob (Gen 28:10-12)
- Jesus words to Nathanael (John 1:49,50)
- 1. Jesus, one with Father and the Holy Spirit: Holy Spirit without measure
- 2. The Holy Spirit descending like a dove alighting on Him.

III. A Voice from Heaven

- The Father affirms Jesus as His chosen Son & His accepted ministry.
- Father's voice proves that Jesus was not compromised by His incarnation.
- Jesus would endure another baptism, a baptism of blood to save His people.
- God has accepted the Son, and we are accepted in the Son. (Eph 1:5,6)

The Knowledge and Power of God unto Salvation (2 Peter 1:2,4)

Last week "Like precious faith"

- 1. Simon Peter, bondservant, Apostles of Jesus Christ (1:1a).
- 2. Those who have obtained, a like precious faith.
- Peter now encourages his readers to trust in the power of God (1 Pet 1:3-5)

I. Grace and Peace in the Knowledge of God (1:2)

- A. Grace
- God's goodness, divine favor shown forth to undeserving sinners (1 Pet 1:2)
- B. Peace
- Grace always proceeds peace in grace and peace are multiplied to us.

II. Divine Power Provides us with All we need for Life and Godliness

A. His divine power

B. Given to us all things.

C. That pertain to life and godliness.

D. Through the knowledge of Him who "called us"

E. By "glory and virtue" (excellence).
