- 1. Please Turn Back In Your Bibles With Me:
  - To Acts 8 As We Continue On:
    - Our Journey Through Acts!
      - Where The Sunday Before Easter:
        - We Were Re-Introduced To One Of The First Deacons Of The Church:
  - Philip:
- Who The Lord Used:
  - To Spread The Gospel:
    - To The Region Of Samaria!
- 2. And Even Though:
  - There Were Some Challenges:
    - In Samaria There Were:
      - Some Great Victories:
        - For The Gospel As Well!
- 3. Well In The Rest Of Acts 8:
  - We Learn Of Another:
    - Opportunity For Philip:
      - As We Begin In 8:26 And Go Through The End Of The Chapter:
        - Read Passage!
- 4. Now What We Just Read:
  - Is A Clear Illustration:
    - Of God's Own Providential Guidance:
      - In The Ministry Of His Church:
        - As The Gospel Starts To Spread:
          - Beyond The Borders Of Judea & Samaria To Even:
            - "The Uttermost Part Of The Earth!" As Jesus Himself Told Them To Do Back In Acts 1:8!
  - Because According To Many Ancient Writers & Historians:
    - The People Of Ethiopia Were Considered:
      - To Be "Living On The Edge Of The World!" (Bruce)
        - And So The Church Continued To Obey The Commission Of The Lord:
          - Through The Direction Of The Holy Spirit!
- 5. And Through This Magnificent Story:
  - Of The Conversion Of The Ethiopian Eunuch:
    - I Would Like To Focus Our Attention Tonight On:
      - Three Important Things:
        - That Led To That Man's Salvation:
          - On That Dusty, Desert Road!
- \* The First Thing We See Is:
- 1. The Importance Of God's Way!
  - That Is The Importance Of God's Way:
    - Of Salvation Which We Read:
      - In The Final Verses Of This Chapter:
        - 8:36-40!
    - After Philip Shared The Gospel With That Ethiopian Man:
      - Beginning At The Very Text:
        - He Was Reading In The Chariot It Is Clear That He Experienced:
  - A Personal Conviction!
    - Because In 8:36 The Man Asked Philip:
      - "See, here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized?"
        - This Reveals That He Understood The Message Of The Gospel!
    - The Man That He Read About In Isaiah:
      - Was Jesus And The Sacrifice That Was Prophesied By Isaiah:

- Was For Him & His Sin!
- And Even Though:
  - Philip's Reply & The Ethiopians Confession In 8:37 Is Not Found:
    - In The Majority Of Existing Greek Manuscripts:
      - It Certainly Reflects What Was & Still Is Necessary For That Man To Be Saved! Which Is:
- A Personal Confession:
  - Of Faith In The Lord Jesus Christ:
    - Which Is The Sole Condition Of Salvation!
      - 8:37 "And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God!"
  - The Condition & The Confession:
    - Found In This Verse:
      - Has Always Been What True Christian Conversion Is Based Upon!
  - Think About What John Wrote Toward The End Of His Gospel:
    - John 20:31 "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name!"
  - Think About What Paul Wrote In:
    - Romans 10:9-10 "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. / For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation!"
  - However This Was Said By Philip & The Ethiopian Eunuch:
    - This Was & Still Is:
      - God's Way Of Salvation!
        - And Philip Was Convinced That The Ethiopian Eunuch Was Trusting In Christ!
          - And This, Then, Led To:
- A Personal Commitment:
  - Through Baptism!
    - 8:38 "And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him!"
  - There Is Much We Can Learn:
    - About Baptism In The Early Church:
      - From This Verse But Perhaps The Most Important:
        - Isn't The Mode Of Baptism, But The Meaning Of Baptism!
  - It Was & Still Is:
    - A Visible Sign:
      - Of A Christian's Devotion & Commitment To Their Savior!
        - That Ethiopian Eunuch Had Decided To Follow Jesus And For Him There Was No Turning Back!
  - And That Public Display:
    - Of Commitment To Christ:
      - Then Led To:
- A Personal Comfort:
  - And Joy From The Lord!
    - Because Even Though Philip Disappeared From His Sight And:
      - 8:39 "The eunuch saw him no more: and he went on his way rejoicing!"
        - With Jesus In His Heart & The Word Of God In His Hand He Had All He Needed To Grow!
- This Was God's Way!
  - And This Remains God's Way:
    - For Us All!
    - A Personal Conviction Of Sin!
    - A Personal Confession Of Christ!
    - A Personal Commitment Through Baptism!
    - A Personal Comfort And Joy!
  - But How Did It Get To This Point:
    - In That Ethiopian Man's Life? Well . . .

- \* The Second Thing We Can See Is:
- 2. The Importance Of God's Word!
  - God's Word Was The Instrument God Used:
    - To Bring The Ethiopian Eunuch:
      - To Faith In Jesus Christ!
        - And Not Just Any Part Of The Bible!
          - But The Old Testament!
  - 8:30 Philip "Heard Him Read The Prophet Esaias!"
    - 8:32-33 "The place of the scripture which he read was this, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth: / In his humiliation his judgment was taken away: and who shall declare his generation? for his life is taken from the earth!"
      - This Is Nearly An Exact Quote From:
        - The Greek Translation Of Isaiah Known As The Septuagint!
    - And So God Used His Own Word:
  - To Present The Truth:
    - To The Ethiopian Eunuch But:
      - Even Though He Was Interested In The Truth:
        - Of God's Word He Remained:
          - Ignorant Because 1 Corinthians 2:14 "But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God!"
    - He Needed In His Own Words:
      - 8:31 "Some Man [To] Guide Me!"
        - Which Shows Us That Sometimes God Will Use His Word:
  - To Perplex The Hearer!
    - Even Though He Had Just Been:
      - To Jerusalem He Never Got The Deepest Questions Of His Heart:
        - Answered There!
          - Because The Scribes & The Priests Themselves Were "Blind Guides!" (Matthew 23:24)
    - And So God Was Using His Word:
  - To Prepare The Heart:
    - Of That Ethiopian Eunuch:
      - To Hear & To Believe:
        - The Gospel Guide He Would Send!
          - Philip Who Would Later Become Known As "The Evangelist!"
    - Because 8:35 "Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus!"
  - The Word Of God Is Essential:
    - To Bringing Light Into Darkness:
      - And Life From Death!
    - And Both Philip & That Eunuch Learned First-Hand:
      - That "The word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword!" (Hebrews 4:12)
    - We Too Need To Be Proficient:
      - In Using The "Sword Of The Spirit" To:
        - Bring The Gospel To Others!
          - And This Is A Life-Long Endeavor To Begin Wherever Someone Might Be In Their Understanding Of God & His Truth And Lead Them To Jesus!
    - But How Did It Even Get To *This* Point:
      - In That Ethiopian Man's Life? Well . . .
- \* The Third Thing We Can See Is:
- 3. The Importance Of God's Witness!
  - God Can Use In Remarkable Ways:
    - The Witness Of A Willing Servant!
      - This Is What We Can See & Learn From Philip In This Passage!
        - God Was Able To Use Philip In This Way Because He Was:
  - A Responsive Witness!

- 8:26-27a "And the angel of the Lord spake unto Philip, saying, Arise, and go toward the south unto the way that goeth down from Jerusalem unto Gaza, which is desert. / And he arose and went!"
- Now Think About Where The Angel Of The Lord:
  - Called Philip From!
    - Samaria! A Place Where There Had Just Been A Great Awakening! Many Samaritans Were Saved! The Fruit Was Ripe For Harvest! And *He* Had Been Instrumental To The Success Of The Gospel! The Opportunity In Samaria Was Still Great! But The Lord Wanted Him To Move On!
- So Think About Where The Angel Of The Lord:
  - Called Philip To!
    - To A Long & Lonely Road:
      - That Was In The Middle Of The Dry & Desolate Judean Wilderness!
- But When Philip Was Told:
  - "Arise & Go!" (8;26)
    - What Did He Do?
      - What Else Could He Do?
        - He "Arose & Went!" (8:27)
- His Response Was:
  - An Immediate & A Willing Obedience:
    - To The Will Of God!
      - He Was Responsive To The Will Of The Lord!
        - He Was Also:

- A Resolute Witness!
  - 8:27b-30a "And, behold, a man of Ethiopia, an eunuch of great authority under Candace queen of the Ethiopians, who had the charge of all her treasure, and had come to Jerusalem for to worship, / Was returning, and sitting in his chariot read Esaias the prophet. / Then the Spirit said unto Philip, Go near, and join thyself to this chariot. / And Philip ran!" [Thither To Him!]
    - It Didn't Matter To Philip:
      - Where:
        - He Was To Witness!
      - Who:
- He Was To Witness To!
- Or Even:
  - Why!
- There Were No Questions:
  - Only An Overriding Quest:
    - To Obey The Lord!
      - He Was Resolute In The Will Of The Lord!
        - But He Was Also:

- A Ready Witness!
  - 8:35 "Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus!"
    - He Knew God's Word:
      - And Knew How To Use It To Point Others:
        - To Jesus!
  - He Was Ready!

## **Conclusion:**

- 1. And Just Look At What The Lord Was Able To Do:
  - With That One Willing Servant:
    - Who Was Responsive, Resolute & Ready:
      - To Use God's Word:
        - To Point The Ethiopian Eunuch:
          - To God's Way:
            - Of Salvation From Sin!
- 2. So When It Comes To:
  - The Conversion & Salvation:
    - Of Anyone:
      - We Can See The Importance:

- Of God's Way As Well As:
  - God's Word!
- But What About:
  - God's Witness?
    - Are You Willing To Be Used By God:
      - To Go Anywhere & To Tell Anyone:
        - About Jesus?
  - And If You Are Willing:
    - Are You Ready?
      - Are You Prepared?
      - Can You Share The Truth Of The Gospel With Others?
        - If Not, Why Not? When Will You Be Ready?
    - 1 Peter 3:15 "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear!"
  - Also If You Are Willing:
    - How Will You Respond?
      - With Obedience?
- 3. There's Not Much More We Know:
  - About These Two Men:
    - Who Met On That "Desert" Road:
      - Between Jerusalem & Gaza!
  - We Do Meet Philip:
    - Once Again Toward The End Of Acts:
      - In The City Of Caesarea:
        - Where It Seems He Set Up His Headquarters:
          - For His Ongoing Ministry Of Evangelism!
    - In Acts 21:8 Luke Writes "And the next day we that were of Paul's company departed, and came unto Caesarea: and we entered into the house of Philip the evangelist, which was one of the seven; and abode with him!"
      - After This In Church History The Ministry Of Philip The Deacon & Evangelist Is Often Confused With The Ministry Of Philip The Apostle!
  - But What About:
    - The Ethiopian Eunuch?
      - Even Though We Never Hear Of Him Again:
        - In The Pages Of Scripture:
          - We Do Hear About Him:
            - Briefly In The Annals Of Church History!
    - According To Irenaeus:
      - Who Lived From 130 202 He Mentioned That The Man Returned Home To Ethiopia:
        - And Became A Missionary To His Own People!
          - And Many Believe The Ethiopian Orthodox Church To This Day Can Trace Its Origins To That Ethiopian Eunuch:
            - Who Also Became A Willing Witness For The Lord!
              - Responsive!
              - Resolute!
              - And Ready!
- 4. Is This The Kind Of Witness The Lord Will Find In You?
