# I. THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS LOVE

- A. Love is the most important ingredient in a relationship with God/others
  - 1. 1 Cor. 13:1-3; 13; Gal. 5:22; Eph. 6:24
    - a. Jesus did emphasize importance of faith: John 6:35; 53; 7:38
    - b. yet He called special attention to love: John 21:15-17
  - 2. Meaning of the New Testament 'love' (agapao)
    - a. describes God's love toward His Son (John 17:26) world (John 3:16)
      - His believing people (John 14:21)
    - b. Biblical love is
      - know by its actions: 1 John 4:9,10
      - not drawn out by excellency of object: Rom. 5:8
      - not necessarily an action propelled by feelings: Matt 5:44
      - seeks welfare of others: Rom. 15:2; 1 Cor. 13:8-10; Ga. 6:10
    - c. Love has feelings, but it is far more than feelings (T. Boston)
      - possible to have stronger feelings for something less loved
    - d. Love to God becomes clear by the choices we make
    - e. Love to God can rational rather than sentimental
- B. God's probing question to us: Do you love Me and My Son Jesus Christ?

## **II. THE EVIDENCE OF THIS LOVE**

- A. True love to God can be consciously known to us
- B. What are some of the *genuine marks that I love the Lord Jesus?* 
  - 1. Grieving about sin (Ps. 119:136)
  - 2. Anger about sin (2 Cor. 7:11; Acts 17:16)
  - 3. Hunger for fellowship (Ps. 42; 63:1-3; Phil. 3:10)
  - 4. Joy in God and hearing His Word (Ps. 84:10; Ps. 27:4)

## III. THE TRUTH ABOUT THIS LOVE

- A. Jesus taught that the 'tree is known by its fruits'
  - 1. Love to Jesus is a *fruit* what is the *tree?* (1 John 4:19)

#### **TRUTHS AND THOUGHTS ABOUT LOVE**
