



Hometown: Nazareth in Galilee. Jesus began His ministry around A.D. 26. Ministry Base in Galilee: Capernaum. Ministry Base in Judea: Bethany Jesus was killed and raised to life around A.D. 30. Crucifixion and Resurrection: Jerusalem in Judea. Jesus ascended to heaven 40 days after rising again.</p>  <p>Prophetic Significance Jesus' ministry lasted half a "week": 3½ years. Gaebelein (Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1979), 593-607.</p>	<p>The Bible Timeline</p> <p>First John the Baptist, then Jesus the Savior— Tempted by Satan, then teaching by seashore, Casting out demons, then calling apostles, Healing on Sabbath, the Pharisees hostile— Galilee finished—Jerusalem showdown: Tried and betrayed, the cross for our sin— God raised up His Son—forever He wins.</p> <p>Who are the twelve apostles? <i>The men Jesus selected to be with Him and send out.</i></p> <p>Peter, Andrew, James, and John followed Jesus on and on. Matthew, Thomas, Philip too; don't forget Bartholomew! Simon, Judas, Little James— Jesus knew them all by name. Three examples?</i></p> <p>Attributes of God God is both <i>great</i> (big) & <i>good</i> (“God” is cognate): What is God? He is <i>infinite</i>—without limits. His only “limit” is moral—He cannot lie or stop being God (Tit. 1:2; 1 Tim. 2:13). Who is God? He is <i>personal</i>—truly good. He is intrinsically good due to the Trinity. The Father, in <i>essence</i>, is “father” (outgoing). God is <i>holy</i> in both His goodness and His greatness. Through being born again, however, we can be made like God in goodness, not in greatness; but like Eve, we want to rival Him in greatness.</p>	<p><i>What is the difference between truth and validity?</i> <i>What is inductive logic? Its falsification criterion?</i> <i>What are the three kinds of logical fallacies?</i> <i>What is abduction?</i></p> <p>Moral Logic What is right conforms to what is true, and what is true corresponds to reality, as God defines reality (<i>by revelation</i>).</p> <p>Classic Example: The Shema (Deut. 6:4-5) It is right to love God only, because He only is God.</p> <p>Note: Jesus proves the corresponding theory of truth, in that He asserts, “I am the...truth” and then explains: “If you have seen Me, you have seen the Father.”</p>

<p>The tutor asks the question and students respond. Parts of the verses can be memorized in the first year.</p> <p>What is the “great commission” of Jesus? <i>“All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.”</i> —Matthew 28:18b-20</p> <p>Note the universality—<i>all</i> authority, <i>all</i> nations, <i>all</i> commands, and for <i>all</i> time (still today!). The church is duly authorized to recruit disciples everywhere.</p> <p>What is the promise of Jesus fulfilled at Pentecost? <i>“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the end of the earth.”</i> —Acts 1:8</p> <p>Note: The church needs divine power for evangelism. We must go “to the end” of the <i>earth</i> and of the <i>age</i>!</p> <p>Practice the “Bonus” passage with the older children.</p> <p>Note: The prayer for deliverance and protection follows the prayer for God’s will to be done. Jesus followed this example in the Garden (Mt. 26:39, 42).</p> <p>Forgiving others is absolutely necessary (Mt. 6:14-15). Our debt is huge—we must forgive (Mt. 18:23-35)!</p>	<p>The teacher should memorize the introduction and quote it with <i>lively emphasis</i>, while looking the students one by one in the eye.</p> <p>Memorize: Do not fret the evil blaze; For evil men have numbered days. —from Proverbs 24:19-20</p> <p>The <i>saying</i> should be memorized, but not the reference. Show the picture (see the document of thirty pictures).</p> <p>Note: This saying must be explained, especially in light of the picture that goes with it.</p> <p>The Scripture uses a double image here: Envy over the wicked <i>ignites</i> our anger (cf. Ps. 37). The “<i>lamp</i>” of the wicked, however, will be put out. Therefore, let the knowledge of God extinguishing their lamp extinguish your reactive anger.*</p> <p>Please explain to the children two things: The “evil blaze” looks big to us (as in the picture), but it will soon be put out by God like a candle. Therefore, do not wish that you had their power. Their power is as temporary as a lamp burning. And parents, is this not a timely word for us? How many of us simmer with anger over who is in power, wishing all along that our party was in power?</p> <p>Thankfully, God is in power all along (Psalm 37)!</p> <p><small>*See Bruce K. The weak force is involved in decay. The strong force keeps together protons, which would repel each other.</p> <p>Isaac Newton – Universal Law of Gravitation <i>How much does gravity pull? Three things tell us:</i> Gravity is proportional to $\frac{MASS \times mass}{distance^2}$.</p> <p>If you are twice as far from the earth’s center, you weigh one-fourth as much. Birthplace: Bethlehem in Judea. Hometown: Nazareth in Galilee. Jesus began His ministry around A.D. 26. Ministry Base in Galilee: Capernaum. Ministry Base in Judea: Bethany Jesus was killed and raised to life around A.D. 30. Crucifixion and Resurrection: Jerusalem in Judea. Jesus ascended to heaven 40 days after rising again. <i>Recall: Galilee is in the north; Judea is in the south.</i></p> <p>Prophetic Significance Jesus’ ministry lasted half a “week”: 3½ years. Both Daniel and Revelation include such a time: e.g. Dan. 7:25; 9:26, 27; 12:7; Rev. 12:7, 14. Even 3½ days can be significant: e.g. Rev. 11:11. Rome destroyed Jerusalem 40 years later in A.D. 70. Jesus said so about “this generation” (Mt. 23:36). A generation is often 40 years (cf. wilderness).</p>	<p>The Bible history timeline can be chanted or sung. The following is the sixth part of a multi-verse poem:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">First John the Baptist, then Jesus the Savior— Tempted by Satan, then teaching by seashore, Casting out demons, then calling apostles, Healing on Sabbath, the Pharisees hostile— Galilee finished—Jerusalem showdown: Tried and betrayed, the cross for our sin— God raised up His Son—forever He wins.</p> <p>The Twelve Apostles The answer to the question is not intended for memory. Students must memorize the poem after the answer. The word “apostle” means “sent one.”</p> <p>An apostle is an official representative, who has both the sender’s message (word) and authority (name). Interestingly, Jesus is the “apostle” of God (Heb. 3:1)! Later on, Paul becomes an apostle too, but he is as one “untimely born” and the “last” apostle (1 Cor. 15:8). In the NT, each list of the apostles starts with Peter and ends with Judas Iscariot, who is always called “traitor.” In addition, the fifth and ninth names are the same too! Those who are born of God listen to them (1 Jn. 4:6).</p>
