DOUBTING THOMAS

John 20:24-31

Look at his character

A. Pessimist

John 11:16: "Let us also go that we may die with Him."

14:5: "Lord, we don't know where You are going, so how can we know the way?"

20:24-25: not with others when Jesus appeared; refused to believe unless touch Him!

B. Eager

John 20:26: with the disciples the following Sunday

There are two kinds of doubters: *want* to believe *Not* want to believe

II. Look at how Jesus blesses him.

- A. Hears him (John 20:27)
- B. Meets him (John 20:26-27)

Invites him to fully satisfy his doubts
His Resurrection is physical and historical; not simply spiritual, or a myth

III. Look at his faith

From the lowest to the highest:

"will not believe" (v25) to "My Lord and my God!" (v28)

First to confess His deity!

Sincere inquiring doubters often gain the richest insights through their investigations

Egs: Martin Luther, C.S. Lewis

IV. Look at how Jesus blesses us! (20:29-31)

A. Note of prophecy

Luke 24:47; Matthew 28:18-20

B. Note of blessing

1. Same blessings as Thomas from our faith

E. g. of blessings from faith in John:

- 1:12: become children of God
- 3:16: Eternal Life; 5:24: delivered from Judgment
- 4:13-14; 6:35; 7:37-39: never hunger or thirst
- 11:40: see the Glory of God!
- 14:12: see His power in your life thru prayer
- 2. Also a couple of ways we are **more** blessed:
- Much clearer understanding of the Gospel
- Blessings of Christian influence on our culture

Thomas acted on his faith; took gospel possibly as far as India and was martyred

John wrote these things so *you* would believe in Him and have eternal Life. Do you?
