Introduction:

- 1. **IE:** One Of The Things I've Enjoyed Since Moving Out Of The City Is The Darkness Of The Skies At Night! And Last Week There Were A Few Nights When The Skies Were Clear & Beautiful Here In Central Indiana! And The Further You Get Away From The Lights Made By Man The Lights Made By God Are Even More Vibrant! And Why Is That? Because "The Darker The Night The Brighter The Light" Of The Moon & The Stars In The Sky!
- 2. Well This Was The Truth:
 - That Paul Was Getting At:
 - In The Last Verses We Looked At:
 - In The Book Of Romans!
 - So Let's Turn Back To Romans 3 Together Where:
 - In 3:4 The Apostle Paul:
 - Made This Declaration:
 - About The Nature & Character Of God:
 - "Let God be true, but every man a liar!"
- 3. You See To Paul:
 - God & His Nature Was Like:
 - The Glory Of The Brightest Star:
 - In The Sky!
 - And The Darker The Sky If It Were Made Dark By The Sins & Unfaithfulness Of Mankind:
 - It Made The Righteousness & Faithfulness Of God Stand Out All The Brighter!
- 4. And By Making This Point:
 - He Was Trying To Convince:
 - His Fellow Jews:
 - Of Their Own Unrighteousness:
 - And Their Need Of The Gospel! Their Need Of Christ!
 - You See Paul Knew His People:
 - All Too Well!
 - After All He Believed What They Believed:
 - Before Jesus Met Him On The Road To Damascus!
 - In Galatians 1:14 Paul Explained That He Had:
 - "Profited in the Jews' religion above many my equals in mine own nation, being more exceedingly zealous of the traditions of my fathers!"
- 5. And So In The Verses We Come To This Morning:
 - Paul Anticipates Some Questions:
 - And Some Objections:
 - That His Jewish Brethren Might Have:
 - About God & His Glory!
 - In Fact They Might Have Been Questions & Objections *He* Had:
 - When He Was Fighting Against The Lord & His Church!
 - Let's Look At Those Questions Together:
 - 3:5-8 "But if our unrighteousness commend the righteousness of God, what shall we say? Is God unrighteous who taketh vengeance? (I speak as a man) / God forbid: for then how shall God judge the world? / For if the truth of God hath more abounded through my lie unto his glory; why yet am I also judged as a sinner? / And not rather, (as we be slanderously reported, and as some affirm that we say,) Let us do evil, that good may come? whose damnation is just!"
- 6. Now It Is Normal & Natural:
 - To Have Questions:
 - For God And:
 - About God!
 - But The Problem With The Two Questions:
 - We Find Here:
 - Is That They Were Not Asked:
 - Out Of A Sincere Heart:

- But With A Skeptical Heart!
 - And Paul Knew This & Answered Them Accordingly!
- 7. Because All Too Often:
 - When A Person Is Confronted:
 - With The Truths That We've Looked At In Romans 2-3:
 - About The Nature Of God:
 - And His Righteousness:
 - As Well As:
 - The Nature Of Man:
 - And His Own Un-Righteousness!
 - That Person Turns Into:
 - A "Devil's Advocate" In The Truest Sense:
 - Of That Term!
 - And Instead Of Asking Questions:
 - From A *Sincere* Heart!
 - They Start Asking Questions:
 - From A *Skeptical* Heart!
 - IE: Isn't This What Jesus Himself Faced:
 - When All Of His Enemies Joined Together To Question Him & "Entangle" Him With His Own Words? (Matthew 22:15-46)
 - The Pharisees / The Saducees All Asked Questions Not To Be Taught By Jesus, But To "Tempt" Him!
 - And By Those Same Questions:
 - They Questioned:
 - The Character Of God!
- 8. Now Genuine Sincere Ouestions:
 - Are To Be Welcomed:
 - As Well As Prayerfully & Thoughtfully Answered!
 - But We Also Need To Be Prepared For:
 - Skeptical & Cynical Questions:
 - Like The Ones We Will Look At This Morning!
 - And Sometimes:

* First - Paul Deals With:

- We Will Need To:
 - As It Says In Proverbs 26:5:
 - "Answer A Fool According To His Folly, Lest He Be Wise In His Own Conceit!"
 And Paul Shows Us How!
- 1. A Question About God's Righteous Character!
 - In 3:5-6 "But if our unrighteousness commend the righteousness of God, what shall we say? Is God unrighteous who taketh vengeance? (I speak as a man) / God forbid: for then how shall God judge the world?"
 - In The First 4 Verses Of This Chapter:
 - Paul Dealt With The Jewish Pride:
 - In Their *Privilege* & Their *Practices*:
 - As Jews!
 - And Now:
 - He Deals With A Question:
 - About Their *Purity*:
 - As Jews!
 - That Is What Is The Point:
 - Of Purity?
 - If Like Paul Stated:
 - Their Impurity & Their Unrighteousness Makes:
 - God's Purity & God's Righteousness:
 - Stand Out Even More?
 - So Paul First Addresses:
 - The Skeptics Claim About God's Character!
 - In 3:5a "But if our unrighteousness commend the righteousness of God, what shall we say?"

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- To "Commend" Here Means To Make More Clear & Conspicuous!
                          - Now - There Is Some Truth:
                                  - To This Claim!
        - IE: Again - "The Darker The Night, The Brighter The Light" - Of The Moon & The Stars In The Sky! In
        The Daytime, You Can't See The Stars, Because They All Blend In With The Light Of The Sun!
                 - And - So It Is With God & His Glory!
                         - God's Truth:
                                  - Will Always Stand Out:
                                           - Against The Dark Backdrop Of Our Lies!
                          - And - God's Righteousness:
                                  - Will Always Stand Out:
                                           - Against The Dark Backdrop Of Our Unrighteousness!
                 - And So Will A Christian's:
                          - Against The Dark Backdrop Of This World! Which Is Why Jesus Said In:
                                  - Matthew 5:16 - "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your
                                  good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven!"
        - And So - There Is Some Truth:
                 - To This Claim!
                         - But - As Skeptics - They Begin:
                                  - Their Question With The Word:
                                           - "If!"
                 - You See - They Either Denied:
                          - The Righteousness Of God:
                                  - Or Their Own Un-Righteousness:
                                           - Which Is Probably The More The Case!
        - But This Claim:
                 - Leads To:
- The Skeptics Conclusion About God's Character!
        - In 3:5b - "What shall we say? Is God unrighteous who taketh vengeance?"
                 - This Question Betrays The True Nature Of Their Heart! They Are Insincere & Skeptical:
                         - Because They Are Questioning:
                                  - The Righteous Character Of God!
        - They Ask - If The Light Of God's Glory:
                 - Is Even More Clear:
                         - Against The Darkness:
                                  - Of Man's Sin:
                 - Is It Right For God:
                          - To Impose His Wrath:
                                  - Upon Us / Upon Me:
                                           - For That Sin?
                 - Is God's Wrath Right?
                         - Is God Right At All?
        - In The Mind & Mouth Of A Skeptic:
                 - This Kind Of Question:
                         - Is Nothing Less Than An Attack On The Character Of God Himself!
                                  - And It Is Wrong!
                 - And This Is Why:
                          - Paul Distances Himself:
                                  - Even As He Writes This Question On Paper!
                                           - 3:5c - "I Speak As A Man!" - He Says!
        - This Is Not The Kind Of Question:
                 - That Comes From:
                          - A Sincere Heart - Or:
                                  - From The Heart Of A New Man!
                 - And So - In 3:6 - We Find:
- The Skeptics Correction About God's Character!
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- Paul's Answer To This Skeptical Question Is Strong!

- 3:6 - "God forbid: for then how shall God judge the world"

- One Thing That Christians & Jews Agree On Is That There Is A Judgment Day Coming!
- But Isn't This Also The Longing Of Every Soul! Even Unbelievers, Agnostics, Atheists! They Want Justice In This World!
 - Well There Is Coming A Day When All That Is Wrong Will Be Made Right!
 - And God Himself Will Be The Judge!
- And Even As Abraham Asked:
 - About God's Character In Genesis 18:25 "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?"
- Here Paul Affirms That:
 - God's Wrath Is Always Right!
 - And God's Wrath Is Always Just!
 - And Whoever *Receives* God's Wrath *Deserves* God's Wrath:
 - Because God Himself Is Just!

- This Is The Truth:
 - No Matter What People Say:
 - Or Think About God!
 - Because You Can't Change The Truth About The Nature Of God!
 - IE: Like You Can't Change The Color Blue To Black By Just Calling It That!
 - But Aren't These The Kinds Of Question We Hear Even Today?
 - Maybe Not In The Same Form:
 - But In Words Like These:
 - "Why Do Bad Things Happen To Good People?"
 - Or "How Could A God Who Is Good Let So Many Bad Things Happen?"
 - Or Even "How Could God Send Someone Who Never Heard About Him To Hell For Eternity?" $\,$
 - Many Times:
 - When These Questions Are Raised:
 - They Are Not Asked:
 - From A Sincere Heart:
 - But From A Skeptical Heart!
 - Many Times The Person Asking The Question:
 - Is Not Really Looking For:
 - The Truth In The Answer!
 - But No Matter The Intent:
 - The Answer Is The Same!
 - 3:4 "Let God Be True, But Every Man A Liar!"
 - God Is Always Just!
 - And His Wrath Is Always Right!
 - Deuteronomy 32:4 "He is the Rock, his work is perfect: for all his ways are judgment: a God of truth and without iniquity, just and right is he!"
 - The Best Way To Be Prepared:
 - For These Kinds Of Questions:
 - Is To Be Rooted & Grounded In The Truth About God & His Character!
- * But Then Paul Deals With A Related Question:
- 2. A Question About God's Righteous Conduct!
 - In 3:7-8 "For if the truth of God hath more abounded through my lie unto his glory; why yet am I also judged as a sinner? / And not rather, (as we be slanderously reported, and as some affirm that we say,) Let us do evil, that good may come? whose damnation is just!"
 - In These Verses:
 - We See:
 - The Skeptics Claim About God's Conduct!
 - In 3:7a "For if the truth of God hath more abounded through my lie unto his glory!"
 - To "Abound" Here Means To Amplify!
 - **IE:** Like What Happens With A Public Address System When You Sing Or Speak Into A Microphone The Amplifier Takes The Sound And Amplifies It So Everyone In The Room Can Hear!
 - And Just Like The Previous Claim:

- There Is Some Truth:
 - To This As Well!

- After All - In Psalm 76:10 - We Are Told That - "Surely the wrath of man shall praise thee!"

- But God's Truth Is Amplified:
 - Not By The Lie:
 - But Against The Lie!
 - And Against The Dark Backdrop Of Deception & Sin!
 - IE: Again "The Darker The Night, The Brighter The Light!
 - But Darkness Doesn't Actually Contribute Anything To The Light! And So Man's Nature Doesn't Contribute Anything To The Nature & The Glory Of God!
- This Is Why:
 - God's Faithfulness:
 - Is Highlighted Against:
 - The Dark Backdrop Of Our Unfaithfulness!
 - But Once Again This Claim Leads To:
- The Skeptics Conclusion About God's Conduct!
 - In 3:7b "Why yet am I also judged as a sinner?"
 - This Question Also Betrays The True Nature Of The Skeptic's Heart! They Are Insincere!
 - Because They Are Questioning:
 - The Righteous Conduct Of God:
 - And His Glory!
 - They Ask If The Light Of God's Truth:
 - Is Amplified:
 - Against The Darkness:
 - Of Man's Lies:
 - Is It Right For God:
 - To Judge Us / Me:
 - As A Sinner:
 - For Those Lies?
 - Is God's Judgment Right?
 - Is God Right At All?
 - And This Leads To Another Conclusion:
 - Not Just About:
 - The Glory Of God:
 - But Also About:
 - The Grace Of God!
 - We See This From The Part Of:
 - 3:8 That Is Still The Words Of The Skeptic:
 - "And not rather . . . Let us do evil, that good may come?"
 - The Phrase:
 - "Let Us Do Evil, That Good May Come" May Have Been:
 - A Common Accusation Against Christians By The Jews:
 - Because Of Our Emphasis On God's Grace!
 - But Here They Are Taunting:
 - Both Christ & Christians:
 - By Saying If Jews Are Judged Sinners Why Aren't Christians!
 - After All Christians Can Get Away With Anything They Want!
 - All They Have To Do Is Appeal To God & His Grace!
 - Of Course Paul Deals With This:
 - A Bit Later In 6:1-2 When He Addresses This Same Question For Christians "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? / God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?"
 - But In The Mind & Mouth Of A Skeptic:
 - This Kind Of Question:
 - Is Also An Affront On The Conduct Of God Himself!
 - And It Is Wrong!
 - And This Is Why:

- Paul Distances Himself Even Further:
 - By Adding In 3:8:
 - "As we be slanderously reported, and as some affirm that we say!"
- And With These Words:
 - We See:
- The Skeptics Correction About God's Conduct!
 - Paul Wants Them & Us To See:
 - That With These Kinds Of Questions:
 - And These Kinds Of Conclusions:
 - About God:
 - They Are Not Just:
 - Misunderstanding:
 - The Nature Of God!
 - Nor Are They Just:
 - Misinterpreting:
 - The Truth Of God!
 - They Are:
 - Maligning & Reproaching:
 - God & His Ways!
 - Even To The Point Of Slander & Blasphemy!
 - And So Paul Affirms That:
 - God's Judgment Is Always Right!
 - And God's Glory:
 - Is Always The Same!
- This Is The Truth:
 - No Matter What People Say:
 - Or Think About God!
 - Because You Can't Change The Truth About The Nature Of God!

Conclusion:

- 1. But As Christians:
 - We Need To Be Ready For These Kinds Of Questions!
 - For Questions That Are Sincere:
 - But Even For Questions That Are Skeptical & Cynical!
 - Even As We Are Told In 1 Peter 3:15:
 - "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear!"
- 2. Because I'm Pretty Sure:
 - These Are The Kinds Of Questions:
 - That We Are Going To Be Faced With:
 - As The Death Toll Continues To Rise As A Result Of This Coronavirus Pandemic!
 - Questions & Objections!
 - Whether Sincere Or Skeptical!
- 3. How Will You Answer?
 - How Can You Be Ready?
 - Like Paul You Need To Be:
 - Rooted & Grounded:
 - In The Truth About:
 - God!
 - About His:
 - Righteous Character:
 - As Well As His:
 - Righteous Conduct!
- 4. Perhaps Today Even As A Christian:
 - You Have Questions:
 - That Come From A Sincere Heart!
 - Remember You Can Take Those Questions:
 - To The Lord!

- After All We Are Told In:
 - Philippians 4:6 To "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God!"
- Even When You Turn:
 - To The Book Of Psalms:
 - You Find Many Honest & Sincere Questions:
 - To The Lord:
 - About The Cares & Anxieties Of Life!
 - Because The World In Which We Live:
 - Is A Broken World!
 - And It Leaves Many Questions:
 - Unanswered!
 - But That Is Why In Christ:
 - We Can Sing These Words:
 - "Are we weak and heavy laden / Cumbered with a load of care? / Precious Savior, still our refuge / Take it to the Lord in prayer!"
- 5. Perhaps Today:
 - You Have Sincere Questions:
 - About The State Of Your Own Soul!
 - You Can Take Those Questions:
 - To The Lord As Well!
 - And You Must!
 - Because Like The World In Which You Live:
 - Apart From Christ:
 - You & Your Life Is Broken Too!
 - And Leaves Many Questions Unanswered Because Of Your Sin!
 - But God Has An Answer For You Today!
 - As Psalm 34:18 "The LORD is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit!"
 - Jesus Came To Be The Answer:
 - To The Sincere Question:
 - "What Must I Do To Be Saved?"
 - And The Answer Given:
 - To The Philippian Jailor In Acts 16:31:
 - Is The Same Answer For You:
 - "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved!"
 - Turn From Your Sin & Turn From Your-Self:
 - And Turn To & Trust In:
 - The One Who Died For You, Was Buried, And Rose Again All:
 - To Bring You "Out Of Darkness Into His Marvelous Light!" (1 Peter 2:9)
- 6. But There's A Warning:
 - In These Verses As Well!
 - If You Or Anyone Else:
 - Asks These Questions:
 - Out Of A Skeptical Heart:
 - Be Warned!
 - Because When You:
 - Use Your Ouestions:
 - To Question The:
 - Character & Conduct:
 - Of God Himself:
 - Paul Adds At The End Of 3:8:
 - "Whose Damnation / Judgment Is Just!"
- 7. What Questions:
 - Do You Have This Morning?
 - And What Are Your Questions:
 - Like?
 - Are They Sincere?

- Or - Are They Skeptical?

- * Do You Have Questions For The Lord Today?
- * If So, How Are You Asking Them?
- * With A Sincere Heart? Or With A Skeptical Heart?
- * And Are You Willing To Trust Him With His Answer?

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
