The Cry of the Blessed

This fourth stanza of the 119th Psalm is outlined by the consonant <i>Daleth</i> . The character for <i>Daleth</i> has much with the Hebrew consonant <i>Resh</i> . In fact, they are nearly identical. This is what Christ was referencing when He said, "Think not that I am come to the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one or one shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled." (Matt. 5.17-18)

The Psalmist is in a dire time. He states that his <i>soul unto the dust</i> . Perhaps this thought continues from the previous section, where he speaks of <i>being a</i> , <i>his soul</i> , and the <i>reproach and</i> being placed upon him. These, among many others, would make the soul of any saint to be crushed to the dust. Disappointment, burdens and grief have made his soul to melt!

There is only One that can deliver him from this terrible time. He cries out, <i>quicken thou me</i> It is only God that can life (Ezek. 37, John 11). Each believer has experienced the spiritual quickening that ONLY God can give (Eph. 2.1, 5; Col. 2.13). His is the vital instrument that produces this quickening (Heb. 4.12) .
