PASTOR'S PRAYER

Almighty God, You are Creator, altogether Other, transcendent. You are unchanging. You are independent. You are Eternal. You are everywhere present. You are our One True God, the Holy One. But a sure, worthy, sustaining comfort which is firmly fixed in the cross work of Christ, our Savior, Lord, and great means of eternal comfort. Amen & Amen.
