## Why train your children?

## Psalm 127 says

<sup>3</sup> Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD,

the fruit of the womb a reward.

**Children** are a gift from God, and they are **meant** to a <u>blessing</u> to their parents.

But we all know.. Children can be a curse.

- They can steal your joy.
- Make you worry.
- Keep you up at night.
- And basically <u>ruin</u> your life.

## Proverbs 17:25

A foolish son is a grief to his father and bitterness to her who bore him.

- The **foolish CHILD** makes <u>daddy sad</u>.
- And mommy bitter and angry.
