### LARGER CATECHISM

## Q. 127. What is the honour that inferiors owe to their superiors?

A. The honour which inferiors owe to their superiors is, <u>all due reverence</u> in heart, word, and behaviour; prayer and thanksgiving for them; imitation of their virtues and graces; willing obedience to their lawful commands and counsels; due submission to their corrections; fidelity to, defence, and maintenance of their persons and authority, according to their several ranks, and the nature of their places; bearing with their infirmities, and covering them in love, that so they may be an honour to them and to their government.
