Love Better Than Wine

I. Describing a Husband's Love

- A. Solomon's wife remembers his love for her and describes it as better than wine.
 - 1. The Shulamite, is speaking to the daughters of Jerusalem, who are her friends.
 - 2. She describes his love as better than wine, which describes a husband's love.
 - 3. This love of Solomon for his wife is rooted in the good character of Solomon (vs. 3).
- B. As the Shulamite remembers Solomon's love for her, she is drawn to and attracted to him.
 - 1. Notice how we see this in the text:
 - We learn that the love of a husband draws his wife to him.

II. Describing Christ's Love

- A. As the Shulamite remembered Solomon's love for her, so we remember the higher, better, more exceeding love of Christ for His church.
 - 1. How great is Jesus' love for the church. His love is better than wine.
 - 2. This love of Christ for the church is rooted in His good character.
- B. Just as the Shulamite was drawn to Solomon, so also we are drawn to Him.
 - 1. What we desire more than anything else is fellowship with Him.
 - Just as the Shulamite spoke to her friends about Solomon's love, so also we should speak to each other and to others about the love of Christ for us.
