What Congregations Owe to their Elders, Pt. 4 (1 Peter 5:5a) 5/12/19, GCC Morning Worship

Introduction:

- A. Review of 1 Peter 5:1–5a
 - 1. The congregation must submit to the elders in the church
 - 2. A real God-given authority
 - 3. What submission does not mean:
 - a. Submission does not mean that you give the elders absolute authority over your consciences and wills.
 - b. Submission to elders does not mean that you are to regard your elders as infallible in their interpretation and application of scripture.
 - c. Submission does not mean that members must agree with their elders in matters of judgment and wisdom which are not explicitly addressed in scripture
- B. <u>Main Idea:</u> To be submissive to elders means that you conscientiously embrace, from the heart, every aspect of their bible-based efforts to shepherd and oversee you as part of the flock of God committed to them
- C. What Does it mean that congregations are to submit to their elders?
 - 1. It is the congregation's duty and privilege to be present when their shepherds feed them with the Word of God (5:2)
- I. Submission means that the congregation heeds the biblically-based warnings of their shepherds (5:2)
 - A. Shepherds warn against false teaching
 - B. Shepherds warn against competing loves (Ps 19:11; cf. Col 1:28)
- II. Submission means that the congregation doesn't run and hide when the shepherd comes to heal or restore them with the Word of God (5:2)
 - A. False Shepherds Refuse to heal, restore, and seek out straying sheep (Ezek 34; cf. Prov 27:6)
 - B. Christians must be willing to drink the healing elixir and let the shepherds remove the ticks and the burrs from their fleece
- III. Submission means the congregation follows the example of their shepherds in so far as their shepherds are imitating Christ (5:3; cf. Heb 13:7)
 - A. Leaders offer exemplary lives for imitation
 - 1. Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands (1 Tim 5:22)
- IV. Clothe Yourselves with the Humility of Christ (5:5b)
