"Striving with Men and with God"

Genesis 32

Big Idea: We must prevail not only with men but with God.

- I. The Account in This Text
 - a. God sends his messengers to Jacob. (verses 1–2)
 - b. Jacob sends his messengers to Esau. (verses 3–8)
 - c. Jacob calls on God for deliverance from Esau. (verses 9–12)
 - d. Jacob sends gifts ahead to gain Esau's favor. (verses 13–21)
 - e. Jacob wrestles with God to gain his favor. (verses 22–32)

- II. The Applications of This Text
 - a. Past guilt is often our most formidable foe.

b. Behind our visible conflicts lie the invisible conflicts of the heavenly host.
