I. The Gospel and Caring Enough to Confront (vv. 1-2)

Galatians 6:1-2 (NKJV)

- 1 Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.
- 2 Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.



2 Timothy 2:24-25 (NKJV)

- 24 And a servant of the Lord must not quarrel but be gentle to all, able to teach, patient,
- 25 in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth,

- 3 Honor widows who are really widows.

16 If any believing man or woman has widows, let them relieve them, and do not let the church be burdened, that it may relieve those who are really widows.



Deuteronomy 14:29 (NKJV)

Deuteronomy 27:19 (NKJV)

19 'Cursed is the one who perverts the justice due the stranger, the fatherless, and widow.' "And all the people shall say, 'Amen!"
