Introduction ~ May 11, 1685 – The Two Margarets

I. The opening of the fifth seal: What John saw (6:9)

- A. I saw underneath the altar
- B. The souls of those who had been slain
- C. Because of the Word of God and the testimony which they maintained

John pictures the church as a suffering church, a church of martyrs.

II. What John heard: The cries of the martyrs (6:10)

- A. They cried out with a loud voice
- B. How long, O Lord, Holy and True
 - 1. "How long" is the cry of the OT saints Psa 13:1-2; 35:17; 62:3 74:10; Hab. 1:2; Zech 1:12; Luke 18:7
 - They address God
 O Despot (O Sovereign Master)
 Holy does not abide evil
 True faithful to His own
- C. Will You Refrain from judging and avenging our blood
- D. On those who dwell on the earth?

III. What John heard: Comfort (6:11)

A. There was given to each of them a white robe Belong to God (7:9, 13-14); Lived righteously (3:4-5, 18)

The metaphor of white robes connotes the idea of a purity which has resulted from persevering faith tested by the refining fire of tribulation¹

- B. They were told that they should rest for a little while longer Rev. 14:13
- C. Until the fellow-servants and brothers, who are about to be killed, are fulfilled, even as they
