# Proverbs provides PRACTICAL WISDOM.

Proverbs contains immensely practical wisdom such as fearing/obeying God (ch.1); Guarding your friends (ch1); Guarding form dangerous men/women (ch.2); Not following your own heart (ch.3); Fleeing temptation (ch.4); Warnings against immorality (ch.5); gaining God's wisdom from Scripture (ch.1-2); and now in ch.6 we get more practical wisdom in (1) financial obligation matters; and (2) self discipline matters.

## Chapter 6 is on "Dangerous Temptations"

Solomon singled out a few more serious errors to avoid in addition to marital unfaithfulness. These include assuming liability for the debts of others (vv. 1-5), being lazy (vv. 6-11), being untruthful (vv. 12-15), and seven other practices that need no clarification (vv. 16-19).

A prudent person is one who is capable of exercising sound judgment in practical matters. He or she is cautious and discreet in conduct, is circumspect, and is sensible. We often describe a prudent person by saying that he or she has common sense. A prudent person can foresee the consequences of possible actions and behaves accordingly. A godly (wise) person can be prudent because God's revelation helps us see the usual consequences of our actions before we commit them. This is largely what the Book of Proverbs helps us do.

God's wisdom for you on **MONEY** MANAGEMENT // *Business* (1-5) God's wisdom for you on **TIME** MANAGEMENT // *Laziness* (6-11)

## I. GOD'S WISDOM FOR YOU ON MONEY MANAGEMENT (1-5)

#### A. The circumstance v.1-2 —

The Bible consistently and unconditionally and clearly warns against becoming surety or the debtor for another person's debt: Prov 6:1; 11:15; 17:18; 22:26.

#### B. The counsel v.3-5 = 7 impv commands here!

- 1.**GO** (3b)
- 2.**BE HUMBLE** (3c) To humble yourself is a very humiliating word = it means to lay down on the ground and let the other guy trample all over you and call you every bad name, but you go ahead and do it anyway >> but you get yourself free.
- 3.**BE SERIOUS & IMPORTUNATE** (3d) To plead / to importune to pester, to badger, to constantly interrupt; To press your plea / importunate = suggests being bold and active and persistent.
- **4.WASTE NO TIME** (4) Not even one night was to pass before the situation should be addressed.
- 5.**DELIVER YOURSELF** (5) be responsible; circumspect.

### II. GOD'S WISDOM FOR YOU ON TIME MANAGEMENT (6-11)

The **sluggard** — One who is lazy; hesitant; slow; he's the man who is *not* upright and he is *not* righteous; He's lazy, making the easy choice; he wastes opportunities and he refuses to do things for his spiritual good because he just wants to rest and take it easy and care for himself.

#### A. The example for the lazy man (v.6-8)

Go to the ant! (v.6)

- An ant is a self initiator he begins the job well on his own
- An ant is a self-supervisor he has no chief, ruler, no officer.
- An ant is a team player coordinated in all they do; they work together.
- An ant is a hard worker he works hard, diligently, dutifully for the long-haul.
- An ant is a future planner he prepares for the future; prepares for future needs
- An ant is goal-oriented nothing in mind but to eat; plan, prepare, work, eat.
- An ant is patiently-persistent swipe them away and they'll be back

#### B. The exhortation to the lazy man (9-11)

Sleep is a blessing (Prov 3:24; 19:23) — but for this lazy man, the blessing of sleep has become the god of his heart. Do not love sleep, or you will become poor (Prov 20.13).

The Book of Proverbs deals very hard blows against sluggards, and Christian ministers do well frequently to denounce the great sin of idleness, which is the mother of a huge family of sins. (Spurgeon)
