## Hebrew Vowels<sup>1</sup>

2.2 **Hebrew Vowel Charts**. In the following charts, Hebrew vowels are presented in three major categories: long, short, and reduced. Within these vowel types, there are five vowel classes (a, e, i, o, u), though not all classes are attested in each of the vowel types. Each vowel will appear with the consonant ∃ in order to show the position of the vowel with respect to its consonant. It is important to note that the vowel is pronounced after the consonant with which it is associated. For example, ∃ is pronounced *ba* and not *ab*, and ∃ is pronounced *bo* and not *ob*.

For each vowel, you should be able to give its vowel class, vowel type, and vowel name. For now, do not be concerned about the physical similarity between the Qamets ( $\frac{1}{2}$ , long a) and the Qamets Hatuf ( $\frac{1}{2}$ , short a). You will learn how to distinguish between them in the next chapter. Finally, you should begin the process of becoming familiar with the pronunciation of each vowel. Learning the sound for each vowel will take some time. Be patient.

2.3 **Hebrew Vowel Chart 1: Long Vowels**. In this type, i-class and u-class vowels are not attested. These vowels are often called "changeable" long vowels.
