But if a man lives many years {which isn’t guaranteed} And rejoices in them all {lives generally a happy life} Yet let him _____ {recall key truths or upcoming events to respond wisely in the meantime} **the days of darkness** {the difficulties of old age and even death which are coming}, **For they will be many** {difficult days ahead}. **All that is coming is** _____ {transitory and without lasting value from a human viewpoint apart from relating to the Lord}. Compare with Psalm 90:10, 12.
2. **The tent-stake: So REJOICE in your youth but remember what is coming in eternity.(11:9)**
“_____ O young man, _____, And let your heart cheer you {by happiness without guilt} in the days of your _____; _____ in the ways of your heart, And in the sight of your eyes; But _____ that for all these {things; what you think and do} _____ will bring you into judgment {His divine evaluation upon death}.” Consider 2 Cor. 5:9 -10; 1 Cor. 4:1-5.
3. **The practical application: Therefore REMOVE the obstacles hindering the enjoyment of life now. (11:10)** “Therefore _____ {self-inflicted} from your heart, And _____ from your flesh, For childhood and youth are _____” {transitory and empty, without lasting purpose & value from a HVP, apart from responding to the Lord.} Consider Philippians 4:4-10; Romans 7 & 8.

B. LIFE Will Be More STRESSFUL the OLDER You Get So REDEEM the Time NOW. (12:1-7)

1. **What?** _____ - is an imperative command meaning to remember or recall information, truths, or events with a focus on responding in a wise manner in light of them.
