### I. Introduction: Why is evangelism so hard for so many of us?

## II. Do you love the lost and pray for their salvation? 10:1

- A. Paul cared deeply for his unbelieving kinsmen and prayed for their salvation. 10:1a
  - 1. He knew what awaited them if they continue in unbelief.
  - 2. His heart was broken for them. 9:1-5
  - 3. Paul's concern reflects God's concern for the lost which is expressed in the free offer of the gospel. Acts 17:30 Is. 45:22 John 7:38 Mt. 11:28 23:37 Ezek. 33:11

# B. Application.

- 1. Evangelism begins with a sincere love for the unsaved.
- 2. We need to pray more for the lost and for our outreach to them. Co. 4:3 Acts 4:29

## III. Do you clearly understand the gospel message? 10:2-13

- A. If you try to make yourself righteous by law keeping, you will fail. v. 2-5 10:2-3
  - 1. When it comes to righteousness, sincerity and zeal are not enough. v. 2 Mk. 10:20
  - 2. The Jews, like virtually all other religious, tried to establish their own righteousness by their works. 10:3a
  - 3. The person who perfectly keeps God's law shall live. v. 5 Lev. 18:5 Eze. 20:11,13
  - 4. But no one is able to keep God's law well enough to earn salvation. 10:5 3:20,23,10 James 2:10 Mark 12:29ff Matthew 5:20ff 19:16ff Gal. 3:24
  - 5. Those who break God's law are under God's curse. 6:23 Gal. 3:10 Deut. 27:26
- B. You can only gain the righteousness God demands through faith in Christ. 10:4-13
  - 1. God has already done all that is necessary for you to be saved. v. 6-7
    - a. God the Son has come down from heaven. John 1:1.14 Gal. 4:4
    - b. God the Father has raised Him from the dead. 1:4 4:25
  - 2. Jesus has perfectly met God's demand for righteousness. Gal. 3:13-14
    - a. He perfectly kept God's law, fulfilling its requirement for us. 10:48:4
    - b. He received the punishment sinners deserve for our sinful lawbreaking. 3:21ff
  - 3. You receive salvation solely through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. 10:8b
  - 4. Inward faith produces outward confession. v. 9-10 I John 4
  - 5. God's promise is great: Whoever will call on the name of the LORD will be saved. v. 11-13 Isa. 28:16 John 3:14-16
- C. Application: Freely offer the gospel of God's grace in Christ to all. v. 12 Jo. 3:14-16

#### IV. Do you have beautiful feet? v. 14-17

- A. Paul has already shown, from God's eternal perspective, the chain of events by which He saves people by His sovereign grace. 8:29-30 9:15-16 Eph. 1:3ff
- B. Now Paul shows how God works through us in calling and saving the lost. 10:14-17
- C. Paul sets forth the chain of events in salvation, from the human perspective. v. 14
  - 1. People must believe in Lord Jesus before they will call upon Him. v. 14a
  - 2. People must hear the gospel message before they can believe. v. 14b,17
    - a. God gives the new birth in connection with the Word. Js. 1:18 I Pe. 1:23
    - b. Those who reject the Word are rejecting Christ Himself. Lu. 10:16 Eph. 2:17

- 3. People must have a preacher before they can hear the Word. v. 14c Eph. 4:11 II Tim. 4:1ff Acts 8:4 11:19 Col. 4:5-6 I Pe. 3:15
- 4. Those who preach must be sent. v. 15 1:1,5 Ga. 1:15-16 2:2 Eph. 4:11 Mt. 9:37ff
  - a. By whom should the preachers and evangelists be sent? Mt. 16:18 Eph. 4:11 Acts 13:1ff 14:26-28 20:28 I Tim. 3:15 II Tim. 2:4 Gal. 1:8 I Cor. 3:11
  - b. In what sense do those who proclaim the gospel have beautiful feet? Is. 52:7

# D. Application.

- 1. The 'foolishness' of proclaiming Christ crucified is God's chosen means by which the gospel is to be spread. 1:14 <u>I Cor. 1:17-25 2:2</u> Mt. 12:39
- 2. Christ has sent out many heralds of good news throughout the whole world. Acts 1:8 Matt. 28:18-20 II Co. 5:20
- 3. Each of us has a role in proclaiming the good news and in sending forth evangelists and missionaries.

### V. Concluding encouragement for discouraged or weary evangelists.

- A. Prayerfully remember the great need of those who remain in unbelief. 10:1
  - 1. Start praying for fruitfulness.
  - 2. Pray for particular people.
  - 3. Pray for boldness.
- B. Remember that God has given you a great and powerful message. 10:2-13 1:16-17
  - 1. Use the Scriptures when evangelizing. 3:20ff Philippians 3:7-10
  - 2. Seek to get people into the Word of God. He. 4:12
  - 3. Don't hold back from freely offering the gospel to all.
- C. Remember that God accompanies His message with the power of His Spirit.
  - 1. People are saved by God's power, not your persuasiveness.
  - 2. God already has chosen a people (sheep). Acts 18:9-10 Jo. 10:27-29,16 Eph. 1:3ff
  - 3. God powerfully opens hearts when the gospel is proclaimed. Acts 16:14 Jo. 6:44 I Cor. 1:18ff 2:14
  - 4. His Word will not return void. Isa. 55:11
  - 5. Prayerfully search for people whose hearts God has prepared.
  - 6. Proclaim the gospel with boldness, trusting in God's power.
- D. Don't give up when the results don't come immediately. I Cor. 3:6
- E. Remember that the supreme end of evangelism is the glory of God. (Lloyd-Jones)
