A death has occurred that has fully accomplished our redemption.

"For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it for you on the altar to make atonement for your souls, for it is the blood that makes atonement by the life... For the life of every creature is its blood: its blood is its life."

- 3. As believers we should rest in God's appointed High Priest and His Sacrifice for our sins. A. What would you say to someone who claimed to be a Christian yet believed that they were free to live in sin because Jesus had already paid the price for their sin?**

- B. What verses come to mind that would help you to show that of he is a true believer, then he should desire to live a holy life not a sinful life?**
