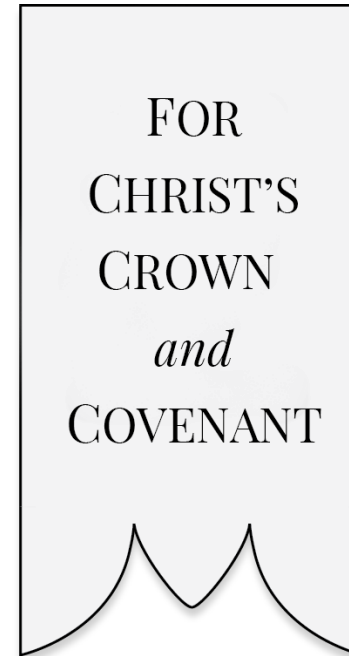

LARGER CATECHISM Q.45 *How doth Christ execute the office of a king?*
