## THE SAFETY OF BELIEVERS

<u>INTRO:</u> In our pericope, we meet the grand climax and conclusion of Romans 8. We find there assurance, absolute certainty that all those who are justified by faith will arrive at a state of ultimate glorification. This is the fifth head of doctrine in the Canons of Dordt: the preservation of the saints. Many passages teach it, but perhaps the two most beautiful ones are I Pet. 1: 4,5 and Rom. 8.

## I. ARGUMENTS ADVANCED FOR THE SAFETY OF BELIEVERS

- A. The decree or purpose of God (vs. 29,30).
  - 1. God chooses certain individuals and predestines them to eternal life.
  - 2. God to glory conforms us to the image of his Son, changed from glory.
  - 3. Those who are chosen shall certainly be saved.
  - 4. The evidences of this election are effectual calling, production of holiness, continuance in well-doing.
- B. God's infinite and unchanging love (vs. 31-39).
  - 1. When we read of the love of God, it is of course God's love for us, not our love for him.
  - 2. He loves us not because we merit it or because of our excellence.
  - 3. It is an eternal love that is infinitely great and unchanging as is God.
  - 4. How can we know God loves us? It is the love of God in Jesus Christ
- C. Three things about the love of God in Christ:
  - 1. The love of God was manifested in the giving of Jesus Christ.
  - 2. It is always a particular, definite love.
  - 3. The love of God always triumphs. Benefits are forgiveness, righteousness, sonship, eternal life.

## II. THE QUESTION: "CAN ANYTHING SEPATE US FROM GOD'S LOVE?"

- A. The question asked: "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?"
  - 1. "Who?" In the list enumerated, a "who" is not mentioned, only circumstances and experiences.
  - 2. The "who" is the devil and his host. The devil as the prince of this world in which we exist.
  - 3. The devil would love to separate us from the love of God as he tried with Adam, Abraham, Israel...
  - 4. As the Apostle enumerates he is thinking of the suffering inflicted upon the church for Christ's sake:
  - 5. Three pairs of circumstances: tribulation & distress, famine & nakedness, peril & sword. A real danger!
- B. Trials will come.
  - 1. The quote from Ps. 44:22
  - 2. Why these trials? Is God not sovereign? Do bad things come from a good God?
  - 3. God is shaping, preparing, trying us, perfecting us.
  - 4. Trials do not separate the true child of God from God but are means to draw us closer to God.
- C. The answer that the Spirit gives. Impossible! Nothing!
  - 1. There are those who wrongly teach that it is possible for a child of God to fall away from grace.
  - 2. In vs. 38-39 a list of contrasts are presented as areas of possible threat
  - 3. The list begins with death which is separation. What about life with its many trials and temptations?
  - 4. The spirit world threatens us.
  - 5. We have our present circumstances. And what about the future? What does it hold?
  - 6. Can there be any force that comes down from heaven, or that arises up out of hell that endangers us?
  - 7. Is there any creature within the whole realm of creation that can separate us or get between God & us?

## III. TRIUMPHANT CONFIDENCE

- A. "I am persuaded..."
  - 1. This faith is not simply I have a particular mystical feeling in me.
  - 2. This faith is not just hoping, hoping against hope.
  - 3. I am certain. This a settled conclusion worked in me by God's revelation to me.
  - 4. What is this conclusion? Not that the world is going to get better, or that trials will go away.
  - 5. Rather, nothing is able to break God's love, turn away God's love from us.
- B. How can I be so certain?
  - 1. We look at Jesus Christ our Savior.
  - 2. Grace makes us look at ourselves and see what miserable and weak sinners we are.
  - 3. Grace makes us look at our God in Christ who cannot deny himself.
- C. Why is this certainty so important?
  - 1. That we may know that God will never stop loving you, so precious you are to him.
  - 2. So that we can suffer well, not give up, but endure trials.
  - 3. So that we can live thankful Christian lives: joy, peace, triumphant!
  - 4. So that we might be strong in the service of the Lord.
