#### 1. Eliphaz's tactics in confronting Job illustrate the \_\_\_\_\_ way to converse with someone with whom we disagree.

- a. Don't take the other person's disagreement too \_\_\_\_\_.
- b. Don't resort to personal \_\_\_\_\_.
- c. Don't be more concerned about \_\_\_\_\_ the argument than being a help.
- d. Be careful of accusations that cannot be \_\_\_\_\_.

#### 2. \_\_\_\_\_ principles for difficult conversations--especially with non Christians.

- a. Seek to be \_\_\_\_\_ and patient in your conversations.
- b. Do not discuss hard questions from the foolish perspective of trying to be \_\_\_\_\_.

*"Paul commands us to reject foolish questions--that is, questions given from the fool's point of view. We are not to submit to the autonomous outlook which suppresses the \_\_\_\_\_ of God; we are not to comply with the demand for agnostic neutrality in our discussions." - Greg Bahnsen*
