## Two Miracles, One Central Message (Acts 9:33-43)

- 1. Fearlessness in Suffering (9:23-25)
- 2. Saul tries to join the church in Jerusalem (9:26-29)
- 3. Peace, edification, and unity in the church

When persecution broke out in Jerusalem, apostles remained in Jerusalem

The church entered a time of peace – Peter began visiting the churches

Peter met 2 believers: Aeneas he healed. Dorcas he raised from the dead

## I. Eyewitness Accounts to the Miraculous

Many healed by Peter – why does Luke draw attention to Aeneas?

Dorcas or Tabitha – raised from the dead – there were witness with Peter Apostles' miracles served important purpose: confirm Jesus' resurrection Miracles of the apostles similar to those of Moses and Elijah & of Jesus Point was not Peter & apostles had same power - but Jesus alive & at work

## II. Christ Manifest in Power – Healing and Resurrection

Miracles as Peter performed them closely parallel Jesus' own miracles

Luke emphasizes that Peter's miracles were done by the power of Jesus

Peter's words used to heal the 2 in Acts: words used of God to raise Jesus

Miracles were accredited to Jesus – therefore many believed the Gospel

## III. Jesus is Always Present with His People

Whether we see risen Christ or not: Jesus' present through the Holy Spirit
The Lord is actively present with us every day, what can men do to us?
