Satan's hatred of Christ and His People (Rev 12:1-5)

You are Herod (Romans 1:18-20, 3:10)

King Herod dies (v. 19)

The wages of sin is death and the soul that sins shall die, so you will die
But the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus, so repent and believe

The child-king thrives (vss. 19-23)

Rachel, weep no more for a new covenant is coming (Jer 31:17, 31-33)

Back to Israel (Nazareth)
