Here the writer of Hebrews begins to unfold what will be the bulk of the letter. He begins to argue that Christ is greater than the whole Mosaic system given to Israel in the times past. This statement would surely cause the reader to draw back in wonder and fear, for it seems an attack on Moses. Remember the name of the letter, Hebrews, it is a letter to Jewish Christians. So as this "terrible idea" is slowly unfolded, we are asked to **CONSIDER JESUS**.

This is not a small matter. It is not only the heart of the Christian faith, but also the heart of all human existence. For every single man, woman and child who ever existed will be judged at the single bar of God's justice, and the person sitting on the seat is Jesus Christ. It will not be Moses, it will not be Buddha, it will not be the imaginary elevated human god of Mormonism, nor the misrepresentation followed by the Jehovah's Witnesses. Mary will not judge, not the thousand gods of the Hindi, nor the false god Allah. Neither will it be you, in all your spiritual elevation who

decides your eternal fate... it will be Jesus Christ, the God-Man, risen Savior, the second person of the Trinity, the very Logos of God who will judge all things and all people. This one exalted, perfect Messiah, who gave Himself in place of His own as a substitute for us. Jesus Christ, Redeemer King who has defeated death and holds the keys of hell. He alone is our judge, He alone is our hope. Therefore, let us consider Jesus Christ - Let us consider what He said, what He came to do, and what He accomplished.
