SUMMARY STATEMENT

The Revelation of John is a Christocentric book that shows us the pattern of this world from Christ's first coming to His second coming.

John wants us to see the spiritual realities around us, to recognize the dangers that face us, and to know that God is going to win.

Revelation calls us, then, to wisdom, to perseverance, and to worship.





Hypocrisy: your life doesn't match your words

- 1. Confessing Christ but not living that way (hypocrisy of action)
- 2. Living like you follow Christ but not confessing Him (hypocrisy of confession)

HYPOCRISY

- A danger when we are pressed by the prevailing culture
- A danger that could look like:
 - Acting one way at church and another way in the world
 - Acting one way in public and another in private
 - Joyfully confessing Christ among other believers, but keeping your mouth shut among non-believers
 - Wanting to look good to everyone

HYPOCRISY

- How do we guard ourselves from this?
 - Remember that Jesus is the all-seeing one we may deceive others, but we can't deceive Him
 - Remember that the gospel is a promise and a command – to follow Christ even through trials
 - Remember that those who honor Christ with their words and their lives will wear white and be welcomed into His kingdom

- When the world around us looks powerful and we look weak, we can be tempted to think that we have lost, that everything has gone wrong, that Christ has failed us somehow
- But Jesus' words to the church at Philadelphia remind us that Jesus' power is made perfect in weakness weakness and hardship isn't a thing to be feared, but embraced if we are weak and face trials because of Christ

- So, when we feel week, we should remember:
 - That no one can separate us from Christ

ROMANS 8:31-39

³¹What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³²He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? 33Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died---more than that, who was raised---who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. 35Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? 36As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; -we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
