I Am For You

“I am for you” is a wonderfully simple yet deeply meaningful statement. If you have a family member or dear friend who can make that blanket statement to you, you know they have your best interest in mind and that they want you to succeed in the path of your life. The kind of backing expressed in such a pithy way can be powerfully inspirational, prompting you to move forward with greater confidence in any variety of pursuits. But hear this: this is the essence what God almighty tells you, if you are in Christ, through the apostle Paul – He is “for you.” A blanket statement like that from God should give you great comfort, courage and inspiration as you persevere in life. The best thing is that He fully backs up the sentiment and has the power to bring about what is ultimately in your best interest. Doubts about the truth of that might arise at times in your life especially if times get rough. Paul offers advice that will help allay those doubts and his counsel is not trite or cliché. He directs us to the most profound expression of God’s love and commitment to His children – He directs us to the cross. *He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? V. 32.*
