


Congregational Confession of Sins

Scripture Reading: Romans 3:9-26

⁹What then? Are we Jews any better off? No, not at all. For we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under sin, ¹⁰as it is written:

"None is righteous, no, not one;
```

- no one understands; no one seeks for God.
- ¹² All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one."
- "Their throat is an open grave; they use their tongues to deceive."

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

The Nicene Creed

I BELIEVE IN ONE GOD, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. AND IN ONE LORD JESUS CHRIST, the only begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made. Who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. AND I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT, the Lord and Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets. AND I BELIEVE IN ONE HOLY CATHOLIC AND APOSTOLIC CHURCH. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Scripture Reading: Micah 7

Woe is me! For I have become as when the summer fruit has been gathered, as when the grapes have been gleaned:

there is no cluster to eat,

no first-ripe fig that my soul desires.

The godly has perished from the earth, and there is no one upright among mankind; they all lie in wait for blood, and each hunts the other with a net.

- Their hands are on what is evil, to do it well; the prince and the judge ask for a bribe, and the great man utters the evil desire of his soul; thus they weave it together.
- ⁴ The best of them is like a brier, the most upright of them a thorn hedge.
- The day of your watchmen, of your punishment, has come; now their confusion is at hand.
- ⁵ Put no trust in a neighbor; have no confidence in a friend; guard the doors of your mouth from her who lies in your arms;
- for the son treats the father with contempt, the daughter rises up against her mother, the daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; a man's enemies are the men of his own house.
- ⁷ But as for me, I will look to the LORD; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me.
- Rejoice not over me, O my enemy; when I fall, I shall rise; when I sit in darkness, the LORD will be a light to me.
- ⁹ I will bear the indignation of the LORD because I have sinned against him,

until he pleads my cause and executes judgment for me.

He will bring me out to the light; I shall look upon his vindication.

Then my enemy will see, and shame will cover her who said to me, "Where is the LORD your God?"

My eyes will look upon her; now she will be trampled down like the mire of the streets.

¹¹ A day for the building of your walls! In that day the boundary shall be far extended.

In that day they will come to you, from Assyria and the cities of Egypt, and from Egypt to the River, from sea to sea and from mountain to mountain.

But the earth will be desolate because of its inhabitants, for the fruit of their deeds.

Shepherd your people with your staff, the flock of your inheritance, who dwell alone in a forest in the midst of a garden land; let them graze in Bashan and Gilead as in the days of old.

As in the days when you came out of the land of Egypt, I will show them marvelous things.

The nations shall see and be ashamed of all their might; they shall lay their hands on their mouths; their ears shall be deaf;

they shall lick the dust like a serpent, like the crawling things of the earth; they shall come trembling out of their strongholds; they shall turn in dread to the LORD our God, and they shall be in fear of you.

- Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance?
 He does not retain his anger forever, because he delights in steadfast love.
- ¹⁹ He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot.
- You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.
- You will show faithfulness to Jacob and steadfast love to Abraham, as you have sworn to our fathers from the days of old.
