RESOLVING ISSUES 5/31/2020 Text: Joshua 22 Theme: You must learn to handle matters wisely.

**Prov 16:20** He that handleth a matter wisely shall find good: and whoso trusteth in the LORD, happy *is* he.

What is the one point I am trying to get across? We must learn to resolve & restore relationships

- You must learn not to assume you know what they meant or what they did (v. 12) Things aren't always as they appear "I heard what you said!" But you might not know what they meant (emotions distort)
- 2. You must not use others for leverage (v. 16) "Everybody is saying..." Several people told me..."
- **3.** You must not think (conclude) the worst (v. 16) Don't jump to conclusions
- 4. You must get clarity before you make conclusions (vv. 13-20)

Confrontation of sin may be proper (depending how and why), **but you first must make sure it is sin** 

5. You must ask questions that create communication instead of making accusations that shut down communication (vv. 16-20)

Accusations make you defensive & either withdrawn or explosive (depending on **character**)

- 6. You must not compare them to others (vv. 17, 20)
- 7. Allow others to explain, and be meek while listening (vv. 21-29)

Also if you are being confronted you should remain meek...

"I'm sorry that what I did looked wrong, but..." "I'm sorry that what I said sounded wrong, but..."

- 8. Handling a matter wisely brings praise to God and peace with others (vv. 30-33)
- 9. You must learn to resolve issues (v. 34)

**Psa 133:1** Behold, how good and how pleasant *it is* for brethren to dwell together in unity!
