 - c. For anyone who is truly penitent, no matter how shameful his transgressions may have been, there is no reason for despair. (Ps. 103:12; Isa. 1:18; 44:22) "Today O that you would listen to His voice. Harden not your hearts!" (Ps. 95:7b, 8a)
