Jesus Used Parables For A Purpose In His Teaching

Mark 4:1-34 (839)

When did you last hear Christian teaching outside? Today Jesus teaches the crowds “beside the sea” (v 1) in the form of a simple story packed with symbolism. Imagine a farmer winding back and forth across his field, casting far and wide thousands and millions of seeds. Because they are *seeds* and not rocks or chaff, each and every seed in that field has incredible potential. Yet conditions must be right, or that seed’s growth will be impaired or stopped altogether.
