# Micah 4:1-5 Let's Go Up to the Mountain of the LORD: Ascension of Christ

In Christ's Ascension the nations ascend to be taught and governed by the Lord.

## 1) Christ demonstrably ascends above all gods (4:1).

- a) "Latter days"—lit. "end of days" places this in context of the coming of Christ
- b) Zion—The Mountain of the House of the LORD
  - i) Sacred Geography—mountains esteemed as gateways to the gods
  - ii) Prefiguration of Christ in whom the fulness of the Deity dwells (cf. Psalm 68:15-18)
  - iii) Demonstrably Ascends: "established"—set up for all to see; "highest of the mountains . . . lifted up above all the hills"—mountains and hills represent various deities; Christ above all (Eph. 1:20-21; Col. 2:9-10, 15)
- c) **Application**: Pagan Revival: Prosperity and pleasure by war, sexual promiscuity, and human sacrifice; Christ was proclaimed as God and King in Pagan Rome (Philippians 2:9-11).

# 2) The nations irresistibly ascend to God's dwelling (4:1-2a)

- a) "peoples shall flow/stream to it"—imagery of flowing uphill
- b) "many/mighty nations shall come"—made willing
- c) "Come, let us go up to the Mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob"
- d) **Application**: Abrahamic Promise—bless all families of the earth; Great Commission—Christ's Kingdom overthrew the gods of Rome. Your labor is not in vain in the Lord! (1 Cor. 15:58)

## 3) The nations are taught how to live by the LORD (4:2b).

- a) "that He may teach us His ways, and that we may walk in His paths"—truth that transforms
- b) "out of Zion . . . from Jerusalem"—"pilgrimage to Jerusalem" / "go into all the earth"
- c) "the law . . . the Word of the LORD"—Torah = legal code and doctrinal instruction
- d) **Application**: Matt. 28:20; Moses & Jesus ascended to give a gift to God's people.

### 4) The nations are ruled in righteousness by the LORD (4:3a).

- a) "He shall judge between many peoples, and shall decide for strong nations far away"
- b) Application: False gods of the nations lead to conflict. Christ, the prince of peace, leads into peace.

### 5) The Ascension of Christ brings true peace to the nations (4:3b-4).

- a) Blessing: "swords into ploughshares . . . spears into pruninghooks"
- b) Peace: "neither shall they learn war any more"
- c) Security: "and no one shall make them afraid"
- d) Certainty: "for the mouth of the LORD of Hosts has spoken"

### e) **Application**:

- i) Pagan gods cannot afford this peace. All peace processes apart from Christ are sure to fail.
- ii) How Should We Then Live? Micah 4:5 "For all the peoples walk each in the name of its god, but we will walk in the name of the LORD our God forever and ever." (cf. Col. 3:1-4)
  - (1) Unjust Rulers in their day (3:9-11a) / the LORD's Righteous Rule (4:3).
  - (2) False Teachers/Priests in their day (3:11b) / the LORD Himself as our Teacher (4:2).
  - (3) False Prophets in their day (3:11c) / the LORD's Own Speech (4:2, 4).
