WLC Q. 44. How doth Christ execute the office of a priest? A. ... in making continual intercession for them. **WLC Q. 45.** How doth Christ execute the office of a king? A. ... powerfully ordering all things for his own glory and their good: and also in taking vengeance on the rest, who know not God, and obey not the gospel. **WLC Q. 43.** How doth Christ execute the office of a prophet? A. ... in his revealing to the Church in all ages, by his Spirit and Word, in divers ways of administration, the whole will of God, in all things concerning their edification and salvation. **WLC Q. 175.** What is the duty of Christians, after they have received the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper? A. The duty of Christians, after they have received the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, is seriously to consider how they have behaved themselves therein, and with what success; if they find quickening and comfort, to bless God for it, beg the continuance of it, watch against relapses, fulfill their vows, and encourage themselves to a frequent attendance on that ordinance: but if they find no present benefit, more exactly to review their preparation to, and carriage at, the Sacrament; in both which, if they can approve themselves to God and their own consciences, they are to wait for the fruit of it in due time [Ps. 43:3-5]: but, if they see that they have failed in either, they are to be humbled, and to attend upon it afterward with more care and diligence.

WLC Q. 49. How did Christ humble himself in his death? A. Christ humbled himself in his death, in that having been betrayed by Judas, forsaken by his disciples, scorned and rejected by the world, condemned by Pilate, and tormented by his persecutors; having also conflicted with the terrors of death, and the powers of darkness, felt and borne the weight of God's wrath, he laid down his life an offering for sin, enduring the painful, shameful, and cursed death of the cross. **WLC Q. 8.** Are there more Gods than one? A. There is but one only, the living and true God. **WLC Q. 37.** How did Christ, being the Son of God, become man? A. Christ the Son of God became man, by taking to himself a true body, and a reasonable soul, being conceived by the power of the Holy Ghost in the womb of the Virgin Mary, of her substance, and born of her, yet without sin. **WLC Q. 144.** What are the duties required in the ninth commandment? A. ...study and practising of whatsoever things are true, honest, lovely, and of good report.
