## The Lord of the Spirits Matthew 12:22-37, 43-45

Introduction: Who is in charge?

## I. Who is the real blasphemer? (12:22-32)

Jesus heals a deaf, mute, demon-oppressed man by casting out demons (22-23)

The religious leaders manufacture a false accusation of blasphemy as an explanation for the miracle (24)

Jesus' defense and conclusion as to the source of His miracle (25-29)

Argument from civil warfare – a divided kingdom will fall Argument from Jewish leaders doing the very same thing

Conclusion: **the kingdom of God has come!** ('Already' and 'not yet')

The binding of Satan ('Already' and 'not yet')

Jesus turns the table on His adversaries (30-33)

He draws the line in the sand, and there is no place for neutrality

The true blasphemers are revealed

What is the unpardonable sin?

It is defined by the context

Have you committed the unpardonable sin?

How do we apply this to our lives?

## II. What is the source of blasphemy? (33-37)

(Good trees produce good fruit and bad trees bad fruit)

The source of evil words (blasphemy) is an evil heart

Jesus' "tough truthfulness" is their only hope to be awakened The place for "tough truthfulness" in our Gospel witness

## III. Insufficient conversions (12:43-45)

(The activity of demons after they are cast out)

Moral reformation apart from Christ is always inadequate

Fill the house ... or else!

Jesus is either Lord of all, or He is not Lord at all
